ASSUMPTION

§208.152 - MO HealthNet coverage of hearing aids and cochlear implants

Officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS), MO HealthNet Division (MHD)** identified 224,154 adults who are currently enrolled in MHD Fee-for-Service could be eligible for hearing aid services. MHD estimates that 7.1% (15,915) of those adults may utilize these services. The average cost of hearing aid services is \$210.73.

This legislation would also result in an impact to the Managed Care capitation rates of up to \$10 million. The cost of the actuarial study to evaluate this program change would be no more than \$25,000 in the first year.

Due to the timing of obtaining a SPA and waiver for this legislation, MHD assumes additional costs for hearing aid services will begin in FY26. MHD estimates 80% of the participants identified will obtain hearing aid services in the first year due to pent-up demand, and 20% in subsequent years. A 6.3% medical inflation rate was used for FY27.

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, MO HealthNet payments shall be made for eligible needy children, pregnant women, and blind persons for, among other services, hearing aids. This bill authorizes MO HealthNet coverage of hearing aids and cochlear implants for all eligible needy persons as described in Chapter 208, RSMo. (§208.152)

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
