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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Corrections, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Department of Public Safety – Highway Patrol, the Missouri State Employee's Retirement System, the Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement, and the MoDOT & Patrol Employees' Retirement System each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for all above agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Administration (OA)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for the OA.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety – Director's Office** and the **Department of Public Safety – Veterans Commission** both defer to the **Office of Administration** for the potential fiscal impact of this proposal.

Officials from the University of Missouri System and the Northwest Missouri State University both assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for both Universities.

Officials from the **University of Central Missouri (UCM)** assume the proposal would have an indeterminate fiscal impact. It may upset employees because it creates more of a process for bargaining units, which can feel limiting. Costs could include replacing staff and/or educating staff on new law.

Oversight assumes UCM is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of activity each year. Oversight assumes UCM could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require additional staffing and duties at substantial costs, UCM could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **City of Kansas City** assume that if 105.519, requiring open meetings, does apply to their public safety unions than it would have a negative fiscal impact because it would greatly lengthen the amount of time spent on negotiations.

Oversight assumes each local political subdivision can absorb any cost associated with this proposal and will reflect a \$0 fiscal impact for this proposal.

Officials from the Newton County Health Department, the Kansas City Police Retirement System, the Kansas City Civilian Police Employees' Retirement, the Kansas City Public

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School Retirement System, the Metro St. Louis Sewer District Employees Pension Plan, the Public Education Employees Retirement System, and the Sheriff's Retirement System each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for all above entities.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** note many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.
