FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§195.807 - Task Force on the Marketing of Cannabis and Cannabinoid Products to Children and Pregnant Women

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** state §195.807 of proposed legislation would establish a Task Force on the Marketing of Cannabis and Cannabinoid Products to Children and Pregnant Women. A representative of the DHSS shall be a member of the Task Force per Section 195.807.2(9) of proposed legislation. The task force, under §195.807.4 shall study the current marketing of cannabis and cannabinoid products to children and pregnant women in this state and make recommendations on whether and how such marketing should be further regulated and restricted. If the task force makes recommendations on this topic, it is highly likely those recommendations would affect the Department's regulation of cannabis licensees; which in turn could impact fees and/or cannabis sales that would result in an impact on total state revenue. However, the creation of the taskforce does not create a fiscal impact. Therefore, it is assumed that the Department can absorb the costs of this bill with current resources.

Oversight assumes the potential for the impacts of the task force's recommendations are unknown and speculative; therefore Oversight will not present a fiscal impact to total state revenue. Because DHSS states it can absorb the administrative costs of the task force with current resources, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for DHSS.

Officials from the **Missouri Senate (SEN)** state the SEN anticipates a negative fiscal impact to reimburse 1 Senator for travel to The Marketing of Cannabis and Cannabinoid Products to Children and Pregnant Women Task Force meetings. It is assumed meetings will be held in Jefferson City during the interim. It is further assumed it will cost approximately \$167.68 per meeting.

The SEN assumes no fiscal responsibility for the other committee members.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. However, Oversight assumes the SEN can absorb the minimal fiscal impact for this proposal within existing funding levels and will reflect no fiscal impact for this agency.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume the Department of Health and Senior Services will provide support to the task force and therefore, assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.
