AN ACT

To repeal section 579.020, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the offense of delivery of a controlled substance, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 579.020, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 579.020, to read as follows:

579.020. 1. A person commits the offense of delivery of a controlled substance if, except as authorized in this chapter or chapter 195, he or she:

- (1) Knowingly distributes or delivers a controlled substance;
 - (2) Attempts to distribute or deliver a controlled substance;
- (3) Knowingly possesses a controlled substance with the intent to distribute or deliver any amount of a controlled substance; or
- 7 (4) Knowingly permits a minor to purchase or transport illegally obtained controlled 8 substances.
- 9 2. Except when the controlled substance is thirty-five grams or less of marijuana or synthetic cannabinoid or as otherwise provided under subsection 5 of this section, the offense of delivery of a controlled substance is a class C felony.
- 3. Except as otherwise provided under subsection 4 of this section, the offense of delivery of thirty-five grams or less of marijuana or synthetic cannabinoid is a class E felony.
- 4. The offense of delivery of thirty-five grams or less of marijuana or synthetic cannabinoid to a person less than seventeen years of age who is at least two years younger than the defendant is a class C felony.
 - 5. The offense of delivery of a controlled substance is a class B felony if:

18 (1) The delivery or distribution is any amount of a controlled substance except thirty-19 five grams or less of marijuana or synthetic cannabinoid, to a person less than seventeen years 20 of age who is at least two years younger than the defendant; or

- (2) The person knowingly permits a minor to purchase or transport illegally obtained controlled substances.
- 6. The offense of delivery of a controlled substance is a class A felony if the controlled substance being delivered or distributed is marketed to minors and:
 - (1) Combined with a beverage or candy product;
 - (2) Marketed or packaged to appear similar to a beverage or candy product; or
 - (3) Modified by flavor or coloring.
