AN ACT

To amend chapter 174, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to opioid overdose rescue kits.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 174, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 174.338, to read as follows:

174.338. 1. As used in this section, the term "institution" means a statesupported two-year or four-year institution of higher education located in this state.

- 2. The department of higher education and workforce development shall consult 4 and collaborate with the department of health and senior services to implement 5 requirements related to ensuring that each campus of each institution in this state, 6 before January 1, 2025, has an opioid overdose rescue kit in a clearly visible location 7 that is labeled with the words "Opioid Overdose Rescue Kit - Naloxone Nasal Spray" or
- other language approved by the department of higher education and workforce
- development.

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- 10 3. An opioid overdose rescue kit required under subsection 2 of this section shall:
- 11 (1) Be visually free of advertisements;
- (2) Be located where it is readily available for public use; and 12
- 13 (3) Include, but not be limited to:
- 14 (a) Narcan;
- 15 (b) Naloxone; or
- 16 Another medication approved by the department of health and senior
- 17 services and the United States Food and Drug Administration that, when administered,

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negates or neutralizes, in whole or in part, the pharmacological effects of an opioid in the human body.

- 4. (1) The location of each opioid overdose rescue kit required under subsection 2 of this section shall be registered with the campus police of the institution.
- 22 (2) An opioid overdose rescue kit required under subsection 2 of this section 23 shall be located in each of the following on each campus of each institution:
 - (a) An educational building;
- 25 (b) A dormitory;

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- (c) A student union;
- 27 (d) A sporting venue;
- 28 (e) An on-campus, free-standing, institution-owned sorority or fraternity house;
- 29 (f) A campus health center; and
- 30 (g) Other locations as necessary.
- 31 (3) In each location described in subdivision (2) of this subsection, the opioid 32 overdose rescue kit shall be on an affixed wall mount that is clearly visible and located 33 by the nearest fire extinguisher.
 - (4) Each institution shall:
 - (a) Perform inspections during the first month of each academic semester to determine if an opioid overdose rescue kit required under subsection 2 of this section is in the required location; and
 - (b) Replace used or expired opioid overdose rescue kits located on the campus of the institution as necessary.
 - (5) A list of locations of each opioid overdose rescue kit required under subsection 2 of this section shall be available through each institution's campus health center and the department of public safety.
 - 5. The administering institution official or other appropriate individual as designated shall report the use of an opioid overdose rescue kit required under this section to the department of health and senior services in a manner determined by rule of the department of health and senior services.
 - 6. (1) Each institution shall provide training regarding the use and location of each opioid overdose rescue kit required under subsection 2 of this section during a freshman student orientation program sponsored by the institution.
- (2) Training regarding the use and location of each opioid overdose rescue kit required under subsection 2 of this section for students other than those students attending a freshman student orientation program may be made available through programs to be developed by the department of health and senior services.

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7. The department of health and senior services and the department of higher education and workforce development shall promulgate rules to implement the 56 provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall 57 become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 58 59 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2024, shall be invalid and void.

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
