AN ACT

To repeal section 163.172, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to minimum teacher's salaries.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 163.172, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 163.172, to read as follows:

163.172. 1. (1) In school year 1994-95 and thereafter until school year 2006-07, the minimum teacher's salary shall be eighteen thousand dollars. Beginning in school year 2006-07, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-two thousand dollars; in school year 2007-08, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-three thousand dollars; in school year 2008-09, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-four thousand dollars; in school year 2009-10 and [thereafter] in each subsequent school year through the 2024-25 school year, the minimum teacher's salary shall be twenty-five thousand dollars.

8 (2) For the 2025-26 school year and in all subsequent school years, the minimum
9 teacher's salary shall be thirty-eight thousand dollars.

(3) Beginning in the school year 1996-97 until school year 2006-07, for any full-time
teacher with a master's degree and at least ten years' teaching experience in a public school or
combination of public schools, the minimum salary shall be twenty-four thousand dollars.
Beginning in the school year 2006-07, for any full-time teacher with a master's degree in an
academic teaching field and at least ten years' teaching experience in a public school or
combination of public schools, the minimum salary shall be thirty thousand dollars; in the
2007-08 school year such minimum salary shall be thirty-one thousand dollars; in the 200809 school year such minimum salary shall be thirty-two thousand dollars; and in the 2009-10

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school year and in each subsequent school year through the 2024-25 school year, such
minimum salary shall be thirty-three thousand dollars.

(4) For the 2025-26 school year and in all subsequent school years, the minimum
teacher's salary for any full-time teacher with a master's degree in an academic teaching
field directly related to the teacher's assignment and at least ten years' teaching
experience in a public school or combination of public schools shall be as follows:

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(a) In the 2025-26 school year, forty-four thousand dollars;

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(b) In the 2026-27 school year, forty-five thousand dollars; and

26 (c) In the 2027-28 school year and in all subsequent school years, forty-six 27 thousand dollars.

28 2. Beginning with the budget requests for fiscal year 1991, the commissioner of 29 education shall present to the appropriate committees of the general assembly information on 30 the average Missouri teacher's salary, regional average salary data, and national average 31 salary data.

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3. All school salary information shall be public information.

4. As used in this section, the term "salary" shall be defined as the salary figure which
appears on the teacher's contract and as determined by the local school district's basic salary
schedule and does not include supplements for extra duties.

5. The minimum salary for any fully certificated teacher employed on a less than fulltime basis by a school district, state school for the severely handicapped, the Missouri School for the Deaf, or the Missouri School for the Blind shall be prorated to reflect the amounts provided in subsection 1 of this section.

6. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Teacher Baseline Salary Grant Fund", which shall consist of moneys appropriated under subsection 7 of this section. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, moneys in this fund shall be used solely to increase minimum teacher's salaries as provided in this section.

46 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys
 47 remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the
 48 general revenue fund.

49 (3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as 50 other funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be 51 credited to the fund.

52 7. (1) There is hereby created the "Teacher Baseline Salary Grant" program. 53 The general assembly may appropriate amounts to the teacher baseline salary grant 54 fund created in subsection 6 of this section. The total amount appropriated to such fund HB 1890

55 shall not exceed the amount necessary to assist each school district in increasing 56 minimum teacher's salaries to the minimum amount as required under this section.

57 (2) For the 2025-26, 2026-27, and 2027-28 school years and subject to the 58 appropriation of moneys to the teacher baseline salary grant fund, each school district 59 may apply to the department of elementary and secondary education for a grant of 60 moneys from the teacher baseline salary grant fund to assist such district in increasing 61 minimum teacher's salaries as required under this section.

62 (3) No grant shall be made from the teacher baseline salary grant fund after 63 June 30, 2028.

64 8. Subsections 6 and 7 of this section shall expire on December 31, 2028.

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
