## AN ACT

To amend chapter 640, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to water exportation across state boundaries.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 640, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 640.406, to read as follows:

640.406. 1. For the purposes of this section, the following terms shall mean:

2 (1) "Beneficial uses", uses of the waters of the state including, but not limited to, 3 domestic, agricultural, industrial, recreational, and other legitimate beneficial uses;

"Commission", the clean water commission established under section 4 (2) 644.021: 5

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(3) "Department", the Missouri department of natural resources;

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(4) "Director", the director of the department of natural resources;

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(5) "Person", any individual, partnership, copartnership, firm, company, public

9 or private corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, political subdivision, water district, or any agency, board, department, or bureau of the 10 federal or any state government, or any other legal entity that is recognized by law as 11 12 the subject of rights and duties;

13 (6) "Water resources", all waters of the state occurring on the surface, in natural or artificial channels, lakes, reservoirs, or impoundments, and in subsurface aquifers 14 that are available or that may be made available. 15

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to withdraw water from any water source 16 for export outside the state of Missouri unless such person holds a water exportation 17 18 permit issued by the department. A water exportation permit shall not be required to

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withdraw water from any water source for export outside of the state where the
withdrawal and ultimate end use are within the same six-digit hydrological unit code as
defined by the United States Geological Survey.

22 **3.** Before issuing any permit required by this section, the director shall 23 determine from the application and any supporting materials whether the following 24 conditions have been met:

(1) There is water available in the amount specified in the application to export
 for water use outside the state of Missouri;

(2) The applicant has a present or future need for the water and intends to put
the water into beneficial use. In making the determinations of need and beneficial use,
the director shall consider the availability of all water sources and other relevant
matters as the director deems appropriate and may consider the availability of
groundwater as an alternative source;

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(3) The proposed use will not interfere with existing in-state uses; and

(4) The proposed use will not interfere with proposed beneficial uses within the
 state. In making this determination, the director shall conduct a review under
 subsection 5 of this section.

4. (1) Within one hundred eighty days of receipt of an application for a water
exportation permit under this section, the director shall determine whether the
conditions of subsection 3 of this section are satisfied. If such conditions are satisfied,
the director shall make a recommendation to the commission for approval of the permit.

40 (2) Upon receipt of the director's recommendation for approval of a permit, the 41 commission shall, at its next meeting from the director's submission of such, indicate the 42 commission's approval or disapproval of the recommendation by a majority vote of the 43 members present.

44 (3) If the commission rejects the director's recommendation, the permit shall be 45 automatically denied.

46 (4) If the commission approves the director's recommendation, the director shall
47 issue the permit within ninety days of the commission's approval.

48 (5) Any application for renewal of an active water exportation permit under this 49 section shall be filed at least one hundred eighty days prior to the expiration of an 50 existing permit. In determining whether a recommendation for renewal is appropriate, 51 the director shall assess whether the conditions of subsection 3 of this section are still 52 satisfied.

53 5. (1) Before granting access to a water resource for uses outside this state, the 54 director shall consider existing and proposed in-state uses in order to guarantee that inHCS HB 2153

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55 state users will have access to and use of all water required to maintain an adequate 56 supply for beneficial uses.

57 (2) The director shall review the needs for water supply export every five years 58 to determine whether the water supply continues to be adequate for municipal, 59 agricultural, industrial, domestic, and other beneficial uses within the state.

60 6. Subsections 3 to 5 of this section are subject to the most recent reports, data, 61 and information in consideration of each permit application, whether the application is 62 for an initial permit or renewal of an active or expired permit.

7. The review conducted under subsection 5 of this section shall not be used to
reduce the quantity of water authorized to be transferred pursuant to the active life of
permits issued prior to such review.

8. On the filing of an application to export water outside the state, the applicant
shall designate an agent in the state of Missouri for service of process and to receive
other notices.

9. In the event of a conflict between the conditions of use required in Missouri
and the conditions required in another state, the water permit holder shall consent to
conditions imposed by the director.

10. The time-limited, active life of the water exportation permit, not to exceed five years, shall require the director to determine whether there has been a substantial or material change relating to renewals of such permits. The director may include additional conditions to address any such substantial or material change when issuing a renewal of such permit. The director may deny permit renewal applications as necessary to comply with this section based on any such substantial or material change. 11. At the request of the department, the attorney general may bring an

11. At the request of the department, the attorney general may bring an injunctive action or other appropriate action to enforce provisions of this section. A cause of action may be brought in any county where the defendant's principal place of business is located or where the withdrawal of water occurred.

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
