AN ACT

To amend chapter 227, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to signs honoring Congressional Medal of Honor recipients.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 227, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 227.855, to read as follows:

227.855. 1. The department of transportation shall place a sign on the city limits 2 of the hometown of any Missouri resident who is a recipient of the Congressional Medal 3 of Honor. Such signs shall be paid for, erected, and maintained by the department of 4 transportation.

- 2. The signs shall feature the words "Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient" 6 and the name of the recipient and the year in which such person received the award. The overall design of the sign, including size, color, and lettering, shall conform to the guidelines and regulations established by the department of transportation.
- 3. The department of transportation shall promulgate rules and regulations to implement and administer the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, 11 as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 13 14 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul
