AN ACT

To amend chapter 182, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to public library administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 182, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 182.951, to read as follows:

182.951. 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a public 2 library that is authorized by state law to levy or collect taxes of any kind shall be 3 governed by an elected public library board, subject to the following:

4 (1) A public library board shall have five members. Any library board that 5 exists before August 28, 2024, may elect to continue with its current number of board 6 members, provided that the total membership is an odd number;

7 (2) An election for public library board members shall be on the general election
8 day established under section 115.121 only. No primary election shall be held for a
9 public library board member;

(3) A public library board member shall serve a term of two years;

11 (4) A candidate for a public library board elected under this section shall be at 12 least eighteen years of age and shall not have pled guilty to or been convicted of any 13 offense that would prohibit such candidate from being present in a public library; and

14 (5) A candidate may declare a political party affiliation to be listed next to the 15 candidate's name on the ballot. If a candidate does not declare a political party 16 affiliation, the candidate shall be listed on the ballot as an Independent.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

17 2. Notwithstanding any existing or future duties assigned by ordinance, statute,
18 or county charter, a public library board shall, at a minimum, be responsible for the
19 oversight and final approval or rejection of:

20 (1) Selecting, curating, and removing materials made available for public 21 lending or use at the public library;

22 (2) All current or prospective public library employees, contractors, or 23 volunteers;

24 (3) All events or activities to be held on public library property; and

25 (4) Any building, infrastructure, or capital improvement projects related to 26 public library facilities.
