HB 1870 -- FEES COLLECTED BY EMERGENCY RESPONSE COMMISSION

SPONSOR: Taylor (48)

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass by Consent" by the Standing Committee on Conservation and Natural Resources by a vote of 14 to 0. Voted "Do Pass- Consent" by the Standing Committee on Consent and House Procedure by a vote of 8 to 0.

This bill extends the authority of the Missouri Emergency Response Commission to collect fees from August 28, 2024, to August 28, 2030.

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that these fees are used to train firefighters and emergency response workers on handling of hazardous materials. The fees bring in just under \$1 million per year and 65% of that goes back to local communities for training. The fee authorization expires this year and this bill would extend the sunset six years.
