HCR 39 -- SUPPORT TO END MOTORCYCLING PROFILING

SPONSOR: Chappell

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Transportation Infrastructure by a vote of 7 to 3, and 1 Present.

This resolution states that one-half of all motorcyclists who participated in a study felt that they had been profiled by law enforcement a least once. Simply because someone rides a motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related apparel should not be a reason to stop and question the person, take enforcement action against, arrest, or search a person or the motorcycle without a legal basis under the U.S. Constitution.

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that pulling over motorcyclists because they look a certain way in not right.

Testifying in person for the bill were Representative Chappell; Joe Widmer, Freedom of Road Riders; and Abate Missouri .

OPPONENTS: There was no opposition voiced to the committee.
