

SS SJR 78 -- ELECTIONS

Upon voter approval, this resolution changes the State Constitution to state that only instead of all citizens of the United States are entitled to vote.

This resolution specifies that all elections be by paper ballot or by any mechanical method prescribed by law.

The resolution allows voters only one vote for each issue or seat to be filled at an election. The ranking of candidates for a particular office is prohibited. The candidate receiving the largest number of votes in a party primary will be the only candidate for that party at the general election. The candidate receiving the largest number of votes at the general election will be the winner.

These provisions will not apply to any nonpartisan municipal election held in a city that has an ordinance in effect as of November 5, 2024, that permits voters to cast more than a single vote for each issue or candidate on which a voter is eligible to vote, or requires a preliminary election at which more than one candidate advances to a subsequent election.
