I am asking you to please support HB1438 and HB1751 which requires the approval of the governing body of an adjoining municipality located within 1 mile from the proposed landfill instead of the current language of .5 miles. The cities and communities located near any proposed landfill deserve to have a voice in whether a landfill is allowed to be permitted near their homes, businesses, churches, recreational areas and schools. My husband and I decided to purchase a small acreage on Peterson Road just north of 150 highway because of the country atmosphere, fresh air, peace and quiet and beautiful views. Before purchasing the property in 1994 we studied the KCMO zoning laws in this area and we reviewed the Longview Lake Land Use Plan neither of which indicated that a landfill would be a use considered appropriate for this area. The plan and zoning indicated that the residential character of the existing area would be maintained or upgraded, not made uninhabited by a landfill. Others who have homes, schools, businesses, and churches did the same research before deciding to purchase homes and build a life in this area. A landfill in this area would be changing the area rules and plans that have been in place for many decades. My husband and I have spent hundreds of thousands of dollars and countless hours building our custom geodesic home. We were owner builders and did much of the construction work ourselves so we could make our home exactly what we wanted. He and I love spending time outdoors and enjoying our lovely property. Over the last 25 years we have enjoyed living and investing in this area. We continue to improve our home by hand making and installing custom cherry and walnut cabinetry, stained glass, landscaping and decks. Because my husband and I did much of the construction work, our home cannot be replaced for any amount of money. He, age 69, and I, age 58, cannot start over again someplace else and build another custom dream home. I had hoped to spend the rest of my life here and have my ashes scattered over the back yard. Many of us who live in this community will be forced to sell our homes because a landfill will make our homes, neighborhoods and schools uninhabitable because of the toxic pollution from a landfill. There will be no escaping the constant stench, noise from trucks and equipment, air and water pollution. Because the surrounding area is heavily populated, a landfill would affect tens of thousands of people, numerous businesses, churches, and schools. Environmental experts have noted that all landfills leak so a landfill in this area will affect the Little Blue Watershed, Longview Lake, Creekmoor Lake and Blue Spring Lakes. Please support HB1438 and HB1751 to allow our neighboring communities to have a voice in what happens to their homes, businesses, schools and churches. My name is Melanie Olson-Cox. I am a parent of 4 Lee’s Summit R7 public school students & I currently serve as the Summit Pointe Elementary PTA president and the legislation chair of the Lee’s Summit District PTA Council. My youngest child is in elementary school at Summit Pointe Elementary (SPE) - the closest school to this proposed landfill a mere 739 feet away from the corner of this proposed landfill site. I am here today to tell you more about the elementary school we have called “home” for almost 11 years. Summit Pointe Elementary is just ONE of MANY schools in the area that would be negatively impacted by a landfill. But it’s been “our school” for over a decade. Built and opened in 2010, Summit Pointe Elementary is home to approximately 540 students in grades K-5 and 90 staff. Every day, this dedicated team of professionals works to make their corner of the world a great place for the students and the families enrolled. This school and its staff represent a huge part of our lives in this community - many have worked at SPE for years- some even decades- and feel like SPE is their home. I can’t imagine our school feeling like “home” with a landfill across the street. Consider the impact to our students: Students: A highlight of elementary school is recess. Many of us can likely recall a core memory spent outside on a field or playground during elementary school. Now imagine every time you went out to recess (2-3 times a day) it smelled like rotten eggs. The smell is not desirable, but I think we all know the real concern is the possible health conditions our kids might develop from being exposed to these gasses/toxins on a continuous basis for the duration of their schooling? Diminished air quality- both indoors and out, potential for leachate to get into the water supply. These are real dangers - that we would even consider putting our children in the middle of this is egregious. Consider the impact to our staff: Staff: Would you want to work across from a landfill? It’s likely that anyone that works nearby will now have to sign a disclosure saying they know the risks. Driving to work knowing that as you get closer, you will start to smell it. Motivating yourself to get out of the car knowing you’ll get the full dose when you open your door. You quickly move inside - and the smell is mostly gone - they’ve added mitigation filters etc, but it lingers and you get little wafts of it in your room all day. Over time, the gasses can and will migrate inside the building too. Unseen danger- but it’s there. Potentially aggravating asthma or other respiratory conditions. Overall, you begin to fear- even dread coming to work, with the unknown of what potential health problem could lie ahead from ongoing exposure to this landfill site. You begin to look for a new job or to be reassigned. Summit Pointe begins to have staffing shortages b/c no one wants to work where it smells dreadful and they could be at risk for serious health concerns. “Our School” begins to crumble. Consider the impact to our families Family: Imagine the conversations parents and kids will have around the dinner table if this landfill happens. “Tell me something fun that happened at school today? Well it was an okay day but not super fun - we couldn’t go outside for either recess - my teacher said the air quality was too bad- in the red. Maybe tomorrow will be yellow b/c I really want to play soccer with my friends.” Parents are now reviewing air quality before sending their kids to school daily. All students and staff

deserve to work and learn in an environment that does not have air and water polluted from a landfill so close by. As our community continues our work to oppose this landfill, I ask you to support this Bill and work in your legislative capacity to ensure this landfill development DOES NOT move forward and future sites for landfills are planned properly to match the needs of future planned communities.

I am in support of HB 1438, changing the buffer zone from 1/2 mile to 1 mile, the notification of a public hearing from 15 to 30 days notice, and inclusion of wording regarding a site being located within 1 mile of an accredited school district. We know so much more about the health effects of living near a landfill and a one-half mile buffer just simply isn't enough. There are many research papers and articles listing the negative health effects of living near a landfill. The suggested distance for a landfill and a resident is 1.8 miles (9,504 feet). Landfills are a home for disease causing organisms. The gases that are emitted from a landfill are associated with a number of issues related to cancer. Pollution and dust will come from this landfill and will be in the direct path of my home, my neighbors and an elementary school located directly across the street from this location. It will have an environmental impact on our waterways and wildlife. The proposed site is at the highest elevation in Kansas City with waterways and creeks throughout that feeds into the Little Blue River Watershed and surrounding lakes. It has been cited by the EPA, "All Landfills leak". It would increase traffic, noise and smell in the area. It would also have an economic impact on property values and any future development. Yes, landfills are needed but not at the expense of the health, safety and wellbeing of the adjoining properties, surrounding communities and schools that were there first.
