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Chair, Vice-Chair, members of the committee; thank you for the opportunity to testify today in support of HBs 1446 & 2632 to support the health outcomes of Missourians who rely on Medicaid for pregnancy and postpartum care. Abortion Action Missouri, formerly Pro Choice Missouri, works to protect and expand every Missourians' right to bodily autonomy, to access essential reproductive healthcare including abortion care, to access accurate information to make the best decisions for ourselves and our families, and to parent our children in safety and dignity. For individuals who want to start or grow their families in Missouri, our state remains one of the most dangerous to give birth; Missouri ranks 44th in the country for maternal mortality and Black birthing parents are 3-4 times more likely to die within a year of pregnancy than their white counterparts. For many reasons, including structural racism and implicit bias in medicine, the closure of seven rural hospitals in MO since 2014, a growing number of people falling in the insurance gap, and continued attacks on abortion and reproductive healthcare access, the maternal and infant mortality rates in MO continue to rival that of both peer and less-resourced nations. In short: restrictions on reproductive health care access lead to poor reproductive health outcomes. The Missouri Pregnancy-Associated Mortality Review Report found that the pregnancy-related mortality ratio (PRMR) in Missouri is four times greater for Black women than white women at 87.6 per 100,000 live births. The same review board found that 82% of pregnancyrelated deaths in Missouri were "determined to be preventable." Recommendations for addressing racial and economic disparities in maternal health in Missouri named in the report include increased access to mental health resources throughout pregnancy, increased coverage of postpartum care for low-income mothers and families, and increased uniformity in trauma-informed and culturally competent practices. Doula services empower Missourians to have healthy and safe pregnancies and to give birth in safe and supportive environments on their own terms. This bill would allow for Missourians' access to these vital resources to be more equitable and accessible to people and families without the resources to pay out of pocket. LaKisha Redditt of the St. Louis Doula Project notes that, "Culturally competent care means you understand the health disparities and inequities that happen to Black and brown people and our white counterparts," Redditt says. "We [doulas] look at care from a lens of what happened to a person, as opposed to what's wrong with them."Increasing access to doulas, particularly for Black women and birthing parents, is proven to improve birth outcomes and is an essential component of addressing the high rates of maternal mortality in our region. Often efforts to fund doulas require them to be connected to a hospital or large practice- This excludes community based doulas, often with some of the strongest connections to their communities, from access to support. This bill would create a registration service for doulas who want their clients to have access to state reimbursement for their services, but would not prevent doulas from operating

without registration. Doulas are an essential part of the reproductive healthcare provider network and are uniquely able to provide supportive care to pregnant people no matter their decision or pregnancy outcome. Doulas are also trusted sources on reproductive health education such as providing information related to fertility, nutrition, contraception, pregnancy health, breastfeeding, and quality infant care. Abortion Action Missouri, representing more than 60,000 Missourians across the state, urges you to improve health outcomes for all Missouri parents and children by advancing this bill. Thank you.

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As of November 2022, more than half of all states offer Medicaid coverage for doula care, are implementing it, or are taking some action related to it. Six states reimburse for doula services in Medicaid: Oregon, Minnesota, New Jersey, Florida, Maryland, and Virginia. Missouri should support women in this process by reimbursing doula services which go a long way to bridge the gaps in both urban and rural settings.

Hello Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. My name is Dr. Rieka Yu from MOST Policy Initiative. We are a non-profit that provides non-partisan research to the Missouri legislature. Today I will be testifying about our science note on insurance coverage of doula services. A doula is a certified non-medical professional. They provide emotional support and education during pregnancy, labor, delivery, and after birth. In Missouri maternal mortality rate is 25% higher than the national average. Older ages, medical conditions, carrying multiple babies, and c-sections increase the risk of negative maternal and infant outcomes. Nationally, black women have more c-sections than white women do. Globally, doula care during labor and delivery leads to fewer c-sections and more vaginal births without interventions. Doulas are also associated with better birth experiences with some mothers saying they felt more involved in decisions and better supported with doulas. States that cover doula services through Medicaid have it as an optional benefit or a preventative service. Some evidence suggests doula services are cost effective for Medicaid because there are fewer medical interventions when doulas are present, but there is not information on the effect of coverage for patient premiums.MO launched a doula pilot program in 2022 for Healthy Blue patients in select cities. In this program. Healthy Blue pays doulas upfront for a certain number of clients each year. However, program output data is still unavailable. Our science note goes further into potential barriers to Medicaid coverage, demographic information about mothers, and other doula outcome data.

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As a doula with roots tracing back to 2021 with initial training from Uzazi VIIIage as a community doula. my mission has always been clear: to serve my community and extended family with unwavering dedication. Beyond simply being a presence on the front lines, I've emerged as a staunch defender of the sovereignty of our birthing experiences, advocating passionately for birthing individuals from the intimate setting of the birthing room to the grandeur of the Nation's Capitol.In my role as a Social Justice Doula and reproductive justice advocate, I seamlessly blend my background in public administration and policy to offer holistic support to clients. Whether in the sacred space of the birthing room or amidst the corridors of legislative power. I stand alongside those whose birth experiences are shaped by policy discussions. My clientele includes individuals who rely on state benefits like Medicaid, and I recognize the significance of fair reimbursement that would come from insurance companies—a recognition that fuels my firm belief that doulas deserve just compensation for our evidence-based, life-affirming care. I wholeheartedly believe that doulas deserve to be compensated appropriately for the work we do to assist birthing people during and after their pregnancy. We bring a set of skills to the birthing process that helps to educate and prepare for pregnancy, labor, birth, and recovery. As a doula, I provide education, physical, and emotional support. However, this belief is tempered by a critical question: At what cost? As a Social Justice Doula, I refuse to compromise the sovereignty of BIPOC birth workers to be subsumed by a system that has historically perpetuated the very inequities we tirelessly strive to dismantle. I know that if we are not careful, thoughtful, and intentional about how we approach policy and legislation, there is a very real potential for history to repeat itself, to cause harm and undermine Doula work that Black birth workers began in order to address the current Black Infant and parental health crisis that the 1921 Sheppard-Towner Act caused. For these reasons, I will not support the legislation in its current form. I have serious concerns with the non-inclusive language that limits reimbursement for services for birthing people that identify as "women", thus excluding non-binary, trans, and queer identities. Also, the state being the body to review and approve the status of a doula is very concerning to me. The likelihood for unintended consequences is extremely high by positioning the Department of Human and Senior Services (DHSS) as the governing body for regulating Doula services. The state is not prepared for this task.Although. I value the recognition of MCDC (A body of birth workers peers) as a possible consulting community organization to DHSS I still have concern with a state agency being identified as the ultimate authority to register/govern doulas. The language of "shall" vs "must" weakens the bill because it does not require DSS to consult or accept the recommendations of community organizations at all. I do believe that in the near future, DSS would honor the bills language and take direction from community organizations like MCDC, however, history has shown us that a bill without teeth is symbolic in nature and leaves room for inequities down the road.My trepidation for a symbolic bill (without teeth) is that as priorities and leadership changes overtime, and the relationships and

good faith agreements that exist because of those relationships fade away, we are left with the subjective interpretation of weak legislative language that gives ultimate governing authority to the state over a presently sovereign body of birth workers, doulas. This bill, as written, creates a possible pathway for doulas to face barriers in the future. For this reason, I cannot support the bill whole-heartedly as it is written, however, I support doula reimbursement as a whole.
