Mister Chairman and members of the committee: My name is Robyn Schelp and I am the Director of Policy and Advocacy for Kids Win Missouri. We advocate on issues of child well-being including child care and early education, child welfare, health and mental health, and other issues which impact children. Kids Win Missouri supports HB 1486 and we appreciate the Governor and Rep. Shield's commitment to improve early care and education in this state, which includes this proposal to expand Pre-K funding for all 4-yr-olds who qualify for free and reduced lunch. A child's brain is most flexible and adaptable to learning in his early years, with 90% of the brain being developed by the time a child is 5-yrs-old. The cognitive, social, linguistic, and emotional skills learned by a young child are crucial for success in school, the workplace, and in life. Pre-kindergarten builds a foundation of skills that help children enter kindergarten ready to learn and thrive. In April 2023, Springfield released the Mayor's Commission for Children's Readiness for Kindergarten 2022 report which showed that only 46.2% of students who did not attend preschool or Pre-K were prepared for kindergarten, compared to the kindergarten readiness of 79.6% of students who did attend preschool or Pre-K. While Pre-K is important for all students, this study showed that it is especially important for low-income students. Among students who qualified for free or reduced lunch (185% FPL or less), only 40% of students who did not attend preschool or PreK were prepared for kindergarten. Kindergarten readiness improved to 70.2% when these students had access to Pre-K.Access to pre-kindergarten is an investment that yields not only successful students but also significant cost savings. The savings related to juvenile justice, welfare, and education would quickly exceed the cost of pre-kindergarten. Georgia estimated that for every \$1 spent on pre-kindergarten, there would be a return of \$5.12. Oklahoma predicted a minimum savings of \$3-\$4 for every dollar spent, suggesting that pre-kindergarten could have other benefits with resulting in an even higher return. We appreciate the work of the legislature to support child care and early education in our state. Expanding access to pre-kindergarten for children who qualify for free and reduced lunch is an investment that Missouri must make and ask that you vote in support of HB 1486.Robyn SchelpDirector of Policy and Advocacy for Kids Win Missouri

Pre-K delivers a host of positive benefits for children, families, the budget, and the economy, including: • Increased kindergarten readiness • Lower rate of juvenile and violent arrests • Higher rates of high school graduation and college enrollment • Lower dropout rates •

Stronger and more skilled workforceThe foundation formula provides an equitable, steady and trusted stream of revenue to local school districts and charters. Allowing districts and charter schools to count all of its free- and reduced-lunch four-year old's will ensure an even distribution of pre-K funding across the state. Aligned's members agree that investment in high-quality early childhood education is the most important economic development tool we have. We encourage the Missouri General Assembly to support HB 1486.
