According to a 2023 investigation, nearly half of all children aged five and under live in a childcare desert in the state of Missouri (Bates & Bergin, 2023). A childcare desert refers to an area where the demand for childcare exceeds availability and is defined as a jurisdiction where there are more than three children ages five and under for every licensed childcare slot or there are no licensed slots at all.According to Census data compiled by Jackson County Public Health, half of the population in eastern Jackson County lives in a childcare desert (U.S. Census Bureau, 2022a). The city with the highest ratio of children ages five and under to childcare slots was Grandview, with a ratio of nine children to available slots. The cities of Blue Springs, Buckner, and Greenwood were also identified as cities with no licensed slots at all. Finally, when looking at race and ethnicity data it is clear that childcare deserts. Meanwhile, Lone Jack, Sibley, Sugar Creek, and Lake Lotawana were identified as cities with no licensed slots at all.
