Missouri Voter Protection Coalition supports reinstatement of Missouri's Presidential Preference Primaries. Doing so will expand opportunities for Missourians to participate in the democratic process and avoid the hurdles, barriers and confusion that accompanies the caucus-only process. In 2022, Missouri lawmakers eliminated Missouri's presidential preference primaries returning Missouri to a caucus system. While Missouri Voter Protection Coalition is nonpartisan and does not take a position on how political parties choose their nominees, we do believe that the state can help advance greater opportunities for participation by returning Missouri's presidential preference primaries and support polling place voting that voters are familiar with. As Missouri's recent 2024 party caucuses revealed, the process can be onerous, time-consuming and confusing, dramatically limiting participation. As a result, only a small minority of citizens participate in the caucus system, typically limited to party stalwarts. The voices of the vast majority of everyday Missourians goes unheard in this process. Missouri Voter Protection Coalition believes democracy works better when Missourians voices can be heard, resulting in a more inclusive, more representative and more participatory process.

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Chairman McGaugh and Members of the Committee, Thanks for facilitating citizen testimony. I am a resident and voter in Phelps County, Missouri and served two elected terms here as county clerk, 2015-2022 after I retired from medicine. I oversaw 19 elections, including two presidential preference primaries, two presidential elections and four August primaries. I apologize if my comments are repetitious. A significant winnowing-out of candidates within each recognized political party occurs through the primary election. It reduces the candidates associated with that party to just one who may appear on the November general election ballot. To my way of thinking, this is an enormous restriction of ballot access. Such an action should be performed only by voters within the political party. Cross-party voting in primaries is a problem. I know this through experience, because I waited on walk-in absentee voters on occasion within my office. For 6 weeks prior to those 6 primary elections I mentioned, we provided walk-in absentee voting in our office. I probably oversaw less than 1/6 of the absentees in this setting, but everyone in the office was obliged to assist voters whenever they arrived. On more than one occasion an individual employed as an election judge—a legal reason to vote absentee—for one party came in and asked for another party’s ballot in a primary election. There was no legal way I could prevent this; it was all within the law. I felt it important to remain expressionless and non-judgmental. But I am here to provide testimony that this happens and my deputy clerks experienced it also. Human nature being what it is, it would be more likely, not less, for this to happen outside the presence of the county clerk, and still more likely at a polling place or in the at-home absentee setting, with relative anonymity. Naturally we would never, ever share the name of such a voter, as this violates the law that forbids revealing how any voter is voting or has voted (a Class 3 election offense). Why should those philosophically affiliated with one party be permitted to weigh in on the selection of a candidate in another party? HB 1878 ushered party affiliation into our election law chapter. Two important statutes are 115.168 and 115.628. The latter states that party affiliation may be declared during voter check-in at any election; could this be employed to receive another party’s ballot? To my knowledge, the current law does not express that affiliation shall restrict in any way which party’s ballot a voter may receive; pursuant to RSMo 115.397 a voter may receive only one party ballot “...designated by the voter before receiving his ballot.” But for even the affiliated voter, there is no restriction regarding which party’s ballot may be voted, at least not at present. Party caucuses are more public. They emphasize the grass roots level of political party activity. They consume several hours, not seconds or minutes, for the expression of candidate preference in the presidential race. At several hours they are still shorter than a major league baseball game or a rock concert, but long enough for people to become acquainted and engage in serious discussions on the merits of candidates.
