The Association opposes the bill. The bill would reduce the assessment ratio for several categories of personal property and, if authorized by a Constitutional amendment such proposed by HJR 88, would eliminate personal property taxes on all farm equipment and motor vehicles. The fiscal note estimates a potential reduction of local property tax revenues and school revenues of up to \$1.6 billion when fully implemented. This reduction in local school revenues will adversely affect public school students and schools across the state.
