Thank you Mr. Chairman and committee members for allowing me to share my story and I am in full support of HB1750 which limits Eminent Domain for solar and wind projects. I'm Charles Greg Crawford, our family has been farming for 4 generations spanning over nearly 100 yrs. We identified over 7,000 acres of proposed industrial solar power plants within 10 miles of our family farm. Eminent Domain to out of state private companies, such as Grain Belt Express (Invenergy) to begin with should have never been allowed. I attended the GBE (Tiger Connector) Callaway county public meeting. During the GBE public meeting, we asked multiple representatives if they intended to utilize the Tiger Connector to transmit/purchase local commercial solar, they emphatically said absolutely not which was untruth because I have a copy of a lease agreement from Invenergy in the Williamsburg area in Callaway county supporting they are trying to develop their own industrial scale solar power plant. My biggest fear is that these solar and wind industrial projects will attempt to utilize Eminent Domain to construct transmission lines to export/transmit the energy to converter stations and/or substations crossing neighboring farms and productive farmland. What is the Tiger Connector's real purpose? Was it to get Eminent Domain for the transmission line and utilize it for their own industrial solar power plant. The same landowner that obtained the Invenergy contract asked them what if he was the only landowner that signed up then how would they get the electricity out and he was told don't worry they will get it out. That's very scary and sounds like a wink wink they will use eminent domain!! We have the Thomas Hill transmission line that runs across one of our farms which is much smaller and far less environmentally intrusive than the proposed GBE & Tiger Connector transmission lines. So I can speak from firsthand experience. The construction process causes extreme compaction of the soil that takes years to restore which results in a reduction in yields, lower production, and economic loss. The additional fuel and labor cost of maneuvering around the bases adds up because these are in place forever. In fact, we eventually stopped row cropping a section and put it in pasture. We are considering adding to our irrigated acres, but these transmission lines make it much more costly and difficult to justify. The transmission lines with their large bases impact the value of farms because it's more costly to build irrigation pivots and also there is loss of productive ground as well. The use of airplanes and helicopters to top-dress fertilizer, insecticide, herbicide, and fungicide are essential in today's farming. This option is not possible due to safety concerns of the lines. The danger would be even greater if the low flying crafts' GPS signal failed or was interrupted. Farming today relies completely on advanced technology systems that include autosteer, field mapping, variable rate applications, plant population application and harvesting data. The use of these systems are from time you begin tilling the ground, to planting, to spraying, to fertilizing, and to harvesting. The agriculture industry is reliant on a dependable GPS signal, but these lines do affect and interrupt GPS connectivity. Let me leave you with this: Is this fair, my neighbor leases their land to a solar or wind power company reaping huge financial incentives, as a result of their decision, then eminent domain is

sought for a transmission line to cross my land that I want to farm and will result in a huge financial loss. This would be like building a boat dock on dry land and then forcing neighboring landowners to allow a canal to be made so the boat can get to water. Finally, for the members who live in towns or cities, how would you like an outside source to come to your home/property and build a 10x10 shed; placing it anywhere it chooses (front yard); you cannot use it but someone in another state or in a rural community gets the benefit of it and it is there forever. This example wouldn't affect your livelihood like the farmers, but would affect your property value and its curb appeal.HB1750 is very important and needs your support. Thank you for your time.

The Sierra Club is a grassroots environmental organization with more than 30,000 members and supporters throughout the state of Missouri and more than 3 million members and supporters in the United States. The Sierra Club opposes House Bill 1750. This bill is an attack on the wind and solar industries, and jeopardizes the future of grid resilience for Missouri. It should not move forward from this committee room. House Bill 1750 restricts the use of eminent domain but only for specific industries - wind and solar production of electricity. If this bill was designed to protect landowners from the misuse or overuse of eminent domain, that would be one conversation. But this bill is a specific, targeted attack on the renewable energy industry only. If Missouri legislators continue their quixotic crusade to artificially cripple the renewable energy industry through intentionally anticompetitive, shortsighted legislation, it could lead to weakening and compromising the reliability and affordability of energy for Missourians for decades to come. Renewable energy is not an ideological boogeyman that we should be spending valuable time and resources singling out and trying to destroy. Renewable energy is a tool to help us generate safe, affordable, reliable energy, relieve strain on our electric grid, and modernize our hopelessly out-of-date generation resources, most of which were constructed in the 1970's or earlier in our state. We should be doing everything in our power to make it easier, not harder, for renewables to come online, while also ensuring that landowners and communities where projects are sited are treated fairly and with respect. We are capable of doing both. Additionally, the biggest threat to our state, country, and planet is the threat of climate change. Already, farmers and landowners are seeing the impacts of climate change. This winter was projected to be 2-4 degrees warmer than normal and we've seen high temperatures in the high 70s across the state in February. But climate change is about more than the temperature -- it is the impacts of that change that cause the most damage. Flooding, dangerous cold snaps, dangerously high temperatures, drought conditions, bug infestations, and natural disasters. These are all things that will impact landowners significantly more frequently and at a higher expense than any wind or solar project proposed. In fact, the best way to combat the climate crisis is to stop burning dangerous fossil fuels and invest in resilient communities -- specifically energy efficiency and renewable energy. Fossil Fuels are dangerous, expensive, and dirty. Just like we cannot continue to rely on outdated modes of transportation Missouri cannot continue to rely on outdated energy sources for our needs. Please reject House Bill 1750.
