My name is Alice Norris. Part of my volunteer community interest is in keeping youth safe from harms like drug availability. THC isomers like Delta 8 and other intoxicating THC products are widely available in Missouri and they are currently unregulated because the Missouri legislature hasn't assigned an executive department the authority to regulate them. In Smithville, we have collaborated with our local law enforcement and county prosecutors to issue "Cease and Desist" letters to businesses who were observed potentially selling these products to individuals under 21 with no procedure in place to ask for IDs at all. This Cease and Desist is effective at keeping availability of these products low in our county, but statewide action needs to exist. HB 1781 has been referred to your committee. This bill, sponsored by Representative Chad Perkins and co-sponsored by Representative Josh Hurlbert from Smithville would assign executive authority to DHSS to regulate these products. This ability to regulate the products would help make these intoxicating cannabinoids less available to youth. We know from decades of research that decreasing availability means that youth will be less likely to use if the products are less available. It is legislation that is needed urgently. Please vote "Do pass" on HB 1781. Let's work together to keep kids safe. My husband was shoot and killed in an attempted robbery by a someone using drugs. It's important that we keep our youth as safe as we can.

I am writing to you today to express my strong opposition to the bill currently under consideration. which could have devastating consequences for the hemp industry and retailers across Missouri. As a member of the community deeply invested in this issue, I implore you to carefully consider the implications of this bill on our families, businesses, and communities before making any decisions. This bill threatens to jeopardize the livelihoods of nearly 5,000 retailers in Missouri whose businesses rely heavily on hemp sales, including my own. For businesses like mine, where hemp constitutes 95% of our sales, this legislation poses an existential threat that could have dire consequences for our families and the communities we serve statewide. The repercussions of this bill extend far beyond individual businesses. If enacted, it would lead to the closure of numerous stores. causing significant economic damage and leaving many communities without access to legal hemp products. Moreover, it would drive consumers back to the illegal market overnight, undoing years of progress in dismantling the black market for cannabis. Hemp stores have long advocated for sensible regulation, including measures such as restricting sales to individuals aged 21 and above, implementing childproof packaging requirements, and conducting standard Certificate of Analysis (COA) testing. We fully support following the federal definition of hemp, which defines it as containing no more than 0.3% delta-9 THC by dry weight volume. It is crucial to recognize that federally legal hemp should not be handed over to federally illegal marijuana monopolies that have been attempting to control the cannabis industry in Missouri since its inception. By doing so, we would be undermining the progress made in ensuring access to safe and regulated hemp products for all Missourians.We must not overlook the fact that hemp has been instrumental in reducing the black market for cannabis. Pushing it back into the hands of illegal dealers would only serve to increase crime and endanger our communities. Additionally, hemp has consistently outperformed other industries 2 years in a row, including craft beer and medical and recreational marijuana, in terms of sales. I urge you to consider the voices of the many retailers and community members who rely on the hemp industry for their livelihoods. It is imperative that we do not erode the trust of the cannabis community by implementing shortsighted and detrimental policies. Instead, let us work together to establish sensible regulations that support hemp retailers and promote the well-being of our communities. We all have seen cannabis around for as long as we have lived, and it is not going anywhere any time soon. If you want to keep us safe, let's vote against this bill and for general hemp regulations that Eapan Thampy and Ron Hicks are suggesting as the voice for thousands of hemp retailers in Missouri, about 5,000. Today is not the day, we need a better plan or at least the general hemp regulation to support hemp retailers not tear them down.My family and the families of our 30 employees and tens of thousands of community members all pray you will do the right thing today and not move us backwards. In conclusion, I urge you to vote against this bill and instead support comprehensive hemp regulations that prioritize the interests of

retailers and consumers alike. Thank you for your time and consideration.

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Testimony of the Missouri Association of Prosecuting Attorneysin Support of House Bill 1781The Missouri Association of Prosecuting Attorneys (MAPA) strongly supports House Bill 1781, which would insure that all intoxicating cannabinoids are subject to the same regulation as marijuana, which happens to be the best-known intoxicating cannabinoid. In passing Constitutional Amendment 3 in 2022, the people of the State of Missouri attempted to insure that cannabis was distributed pursuant to a regulatory scheme and only available from licensed dispensaries. Unfortunately, other intoxicating cannabinoids can be easily found and purchased in convenience stores and other locations throughout Missouri. For example, vape cartridges advertised as containing Delta-8 are prevalent in retail locations all across Missouri. Those vape cartridges are completely unregulated and unmonitored as to their ingredients, strength, and possible adulteration, Delta-8 is an intoxicating. synthetic cannabinoid that delivers a "high" very similar to that of marijuana. Delta-8 contains THC—the full name is tetrahydrocannabinol—which is the main psychoactive ingredient in marijuana. Despite the fact that it is illegal to sell THC in Missouri but for some very narrow exceptions under the law, Delta-8 vape cartridges run rampant in Missouri, often being purchased by minors. Worse yet, when used, Delta-8 provides essentially the same "high" as marijuana. The unregulated sale of Delta-8 poses a significant risk to public safety. The citizens of Missouri saw fit to ensure that marijuana is sold only subject to regulation and in a licensed dispensary in part, as the text of Amendment 3 stated, "to protect public health by ensuring the safety of marijuana and products containing marijuana." Delta-8 and other intoxicating cannabinoids contain the same active intoxicant—THC—found in marijuana. They should be subject to the same regulatory scheme and distributed only from the same dispensaries as marijuana. For these reasons, MAPA urges the adoptio

Chairman Roberts and Members of the Crime Prevention and Public Safety Committee, write to you today to offer support for HB1781, the Intoxicating Cannabinoid Control Act, which seeks to establish control of all intoxicating cannabinoid products in Missouri, regardless of their source. As an owneroperator of two, third-party analytical laboratories, I have had the privilege of collaborating with numerous state and federal agencies as a provider of both analytical testing and research and development services. These agencies include the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) and its Division of Cannabis Regulation (DCR), and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR). With this experience, now spanning 3 decades, I bring an emphasis on the critical importance of comprehensive regulation and product testing in safeguarding public health. My support for HB1781 is rooted in the fact that, currently, the distribution and sales of hemp-derived intoxicants in Missouri (and many other states) remains unfettered. Products containing these intoxicants are widely available in standard retail outlets. Many are packaged to look like common candy/snack products that are often marketed to and consumed by children. As well, many lack proper labeling, leaving consumers unaware of their origin, composition, and potential risks associated with their consumption. In sharp contrast to this is the system established in Missouri to regulate marijuana products, which undergo rigorous testing by third-party, certified labs to ensure product integrity, the absence of contaminants, and the production of information to support proper labeling to deliver of valuable information to the consumer prior to use. This regulatory disparity poses a danger to Missourians of all ages, as these products enter the marketplace without adequate scrutiny or oversight. House Bill 1781 represents a critical step towards rectifying this regulatory gap by establishing comprehensive control over all intoxicating cannabinoid products, regardless of their source. By subjecting these products to stringent testing and regulatory standards, the bill seeks to ensure they meet the same rigorous safety requirements as other products containing intoxicants, including marijuana. Conveniently, it achieves this by folding the issue into an existing program designed for this very purpose. These measures are essential to protecting public health and preventing the proliferation of potentially hazardous substances in our communities.In conclusion, I urge you to endorse HB1781 and take decisive action to address the public safety concerns associated with unregulated intoxicants. By implementing comprehensive regulations and testing requirements, we will take an important step toward protecting the well-being of Missourians and establishing a higher standard of consumer protection. 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I know there are many stories of students being able to purchase these intoxicating cannabinoids from gas stations and then bringing them to school and challenging the administrators and the SROs that they can't do anything about it because it says right on the packaging that it is 100% legal product.But I actually want to take a step back and talk about the need to regulate the products. Executive departments only have the authority given to them by congress and since the intoxicating cannabinoids market began with the passage of the 2018 Farm Bill, Missouri really hasn't assigned any department the authority to regulate them. Not the department of Agriculture and not the Department of Health and Senior Services, At it's most basic, the Intoxicating Cannabinoids Act is just assigning authority and giving a framework to exercise that authority. It is the bare minimum that should be done at this stage of the game. Any opposition you will hear is from industry insiders who have quickly grown accustomed to no regulation. The longer we leave the problem like it is, the more difficult it will be to impose regulation later. Many today might say they are in favor of regulation but are telling you that this bill isn't the correct regulation. That is a tactic to delay regulation. If they have not suggested a different solution, please move forward with this one. We have to be able to prevent our youth from being able to purchase these products from gas stations. Health harms such as decreased motivation, decreased focus, poor school attendance and poor memory skills are already being observed due to youth using these products. Please assign authority to an executive branch agency to regulate these products and give the framework with which to regulate it. Division of Cannabis Regulation and Article XIV are the easiest and best ways to accomplish this.

This bill provides a definition of "CBD" and the variety of cannabinoid products in Missouri and will provide protection and regulation for the safety of all citizens in Missouri. The Missouri Poison Center has concerns about the variety of cannabinoid products available for use and misuse in the state. Mastering the ever-increasing spectrum of THC and cannabis derivatives is a daunting task. Misapplication of the 2018 Federal "Farm Bill" that legalized hemp and its derivatives allows internet sites and small-volume producers that supply the head shops/gasstation markets to sell sources of cannabinoid products that are not regulated, and therefore their content, quality, and safety are not assured. The actual chemical composition and dose may be different from what is on the label. The poison center has concerns over accessibility, standardization. quality control, and adulteration of the various products. As an example, the popular ?8-THC is not extracted from the cannabis plant because there are only minor amounts. It is made by processing CBD (cannabidiol) which *is* produced in substantial quantities in many varieties of hemp. As with many organic syntheses, it is prone to side reactions, including production of ?9 and ?11-THC. A 2022 publication (Ray et al; Molecules) re-analyzed ten ?8 commercial products and identified numerous impurities, even among those that had a Certificate of Analysis claiming nothing else was there. They identified three potential sources of problems – the use of impure CBD feedstock, poor post-reaction purification, and poor analytical practices during certification of purity. Production from low-budget marketers is likely to display even more variability in content, inaccurate quantitation, and potential toxicity. This insight can be combined with clinical reports of toxicity from ?8-THC products in children and teenagers. Despite the "less-potent" nature of this cannabinoid, encephalopathy and decreased breathing requiring mechanical ventilation have occurred. Other less-severe effects, similar to ?9-THC, include decreased blood pressure, increased heart rate, dizziness, stumbling, drowsiness, and distorted vision. It is not yet known what role the ?9-THC and other impurities are playing in ?8-THC toxicity.Delta-8 is readily available and easy to purchase. But more worrisome, the packaging looks similar to food items. Now, we are seeing an increase in poisoning in children from delta-8 products along with the rapidly increasing exposures to children 5 and younger to the cannabis edibles. There are several risk factors when it comes to children accessing delta-8 products. The largest reason is that there are no federal or state-level regulations on this substance. Additionally, there are no

guidelines for proper labeling or packaging. Without appropriate guidelines for packaging, users will not know what the product contains and risk overdosing. Packaging is also made appealing to children by featuring bright colors, cartoon images and often mimics store-bought candies and sweets. Most children eat these products because they find gummies or brownies that they thought were okay to eat. Frequently, the packaging looks almost identical to common candy brands and other food items. Fortythree percent of cases reported to the Missouri Poison Center involve children 5 and younger, so not only is packaging a concern for delta-8 products but also the cannabis edibles. The Missouri Poison Center received 515 poisoning exposure cases for all age groups about THC and the cannabis derivatives in 2023. This is almost twice the number of cases (278) managed in 2021. In 2023, 87% of these cases involved cannabis edibles and children 5 years and younger were represented in 204 of the exposures. At the Missouri Poison Center, we have seen a steady increase of exposures related to accessibility and misidentification related to children 5 years or younger consuming cannabis. Our data shows that the total number of calls have more than doubled every year since 2018. Most exposures were ingestion of edibles but other cannabis products including concentrates, dried plant, capsule or pill form, vape liquid, and others were identified. In the just first month of 2024, the National Poison Data System received 1,887 reports of people exposed to delta-8 THC, Cannabidiol (CBD), and Edible Marijuana. About 85% of the calls were due to exposures at a person's own residence, and 56% of the exposures were kids younger than 18." America's 55 poison centers are among the first to identify emerging public health threats. In 2012, the Missouri Poison Center identified the rising number of exposures to K2 that led to the DEA's ban on synthetic marijuana and bath salts. This current public health hot topic trend needs to be addressed now before the exposures continue to rise and harm more in our communities. We respectfully ask the committee to support HB 1781. This issue hits close to home as my underage nephew recently purchased one of these products from a local unlicensed "smoke shop" in our hometown of Troy and subsequently fell severely ill. He experienced persistent vomiting every day for several weeks, was unable to keep any food down other than water and lost a staggering 30 pounds. His condition prompted numerous visits to the ER and urgent care with his concerned parents, resulting in extensive blood and other tests to diagnose his illness. The severity of this situation is compounded by the alarming ease with which underage individuals can access these harmful THC products. My sister, in her distress over her son's illness, visited the same "smoke shop" (V-Twin Vapors, 10 Centerline Dr., Troy, Mo 63379) and was shocked to find that the clerk, who appeared ill-informed and untrained, incorrectly asserted that individuals only need to be 18 years old to purchase these products, despite clear packaging indicating an age requirement of 21 and over. To make matters worse, the clerk openly admitted her aversion to using these products herself, citing their adverse effects on her health. Also deeply troubling, is the marketing of these products to underage individuals. It is both unethical and perilous for THC products to mimic well-known candy brands, such as Skittles, as this deceptive marketing tactic not only encourages underage consumption but also poses a serious risk of accidental ingestion by toddlers and young children. I wouldn't have believed it if I hadn't seen it firsthand with my own eyes, but it's happening right under our noses. It only stands to reason then, if cigarette manufacturers are barred from using cartoon mascots, youth-related themes, or misleading packaging in their marketing, it would be utterly absurd and dangerous for lawmakers to allow THC products to be sold and marketed to closely resemble a kindergartener's beloved candy. These concerns are underscored by a recent news story wherein several teens purchased a THC product from a convenience store in St. Louis, resulting in all of them being hospitalized. The very term "convenience store" implies accessibility and ease of access, but when it comes to substances like THC, especially for minors, convenience should never be a consideration. It is imperative to acknowledge that it is both a logical and an ethical responsibility to restrict the sale of THC products exclusively to licensed establishments. By doing so, we can guarantee rigorous age verification protocols, effective regulatory oversight, and the presence of knowledgeable staff who can mitigate unintended exposure and advocate for responsible

usage. Contrastingly, allowing sales in convenience stores or unregulated "smoke shops" has already

led to many scenarios in which ill-equipped convenience store clerks and cashiers inadvertently sell these products to minors without proper checks or balances in place, exacerbating the misuse of THC substances and causing harm to said minors. Additionally, education and awareness programs should be implemented to inform adolescents and their parents about the risks associated with these substances. I urge you to prioritize this matter and take the necessary steps to safeguard the wellbeing of our youth. Let us work together to ensure that the purchase of THC products is never "convenient" for minors and that our communities remain safe and healthy environments for all. The repercussions of this bill extend far beyond individual businesses. If enacted, it would lead to the closure of numerous stores. causing significant economic damage and leaving many communities without access to legal hemp products. Moreover, it would drive consumers back to the illegal market overnight, undoing years of progress in dismantling the black market for cannabis. Hemp stores have long advocated for sensible regulation, including measures such as restricting sales to individuals aged 21 and above, implementing childproof packaging requirements, and conducting standard Certificate of Analysis (COA) testing. We fully support following the federal definition of hemp, which defines it as containing no more than 0.3% delta-9 THC by dry weight volume. It is crucial to recognize that federally legal hemp should not be handed over to federally illegal marijuana monopolies that have been attempting to control the cannabis industry in Missouri since its inception. By doing so, we would be undermining the progress made in ensuring access to safe and regulated hemp products for all Missourians.We must not overlook the fact that hemp has been instrumental in reducing the black market for cannabis. Pushing it back into the hands of illegal dealers would only serve to increase crime and endanger our communities. Additionally, hemp has consistently outperformed other industries 2 years in a row, including craft beer and medical and recreational marijuana, in terms of sales. I urge you to consider the voices of the many retailers and community members who rely on the hemp industry for their livelihoods. It is imperative that we do not erode the trust of the cannabis community by implementing shortsighted and detrimental policies. Instead, let us work together to establish sensible regulations that support hemp retailers and promote the well-being of our communities.

In watching this hearing I am disappointed. Most of the folks who testified, except the farmer, did not even properly state the correct statutory definition for hemp. It is less than 0.3% DELTA-9-THC by dry weight. Anything above 0.3% DELTA-9-THC by dry weight is a controlled substance under federal law. Anything below that threshold is specifically lawful. Congress intended for the wide application of hemp beyond "rope" and "automative uses". This is clear through the plain language including isomers, derivatives, extracts, etc. MOCANN has pumped hundreds of thousands of dollars into this bill, in an attempt to monopolize the cannabis industry. There is not a SINGLE provision in the 2018 farm bill that uses "psychoactive" or "intoxicating" as the test for differentiating hemp from marijuana. It is completely made up, and it is disappointing that the marijuana industry is allowed to testify that this test exists when it simply does not. Hemp, whether "intoxicating" or not, if it is less than 0.3% DELTA-9-THC, it is hemp. Whether or not it is psychoactive, it is simply not the legal test to distinguish it other wise. To put it under a federally ILLEGAL substance category simply makes no sense. It would cause more confusion for not only law enforcement to label such products as marijuana, but the every day consumer. This is because its factually, and legally, incorrect. The interstate commerce and constitutional issues this bill presents are vast and I don't believe has been thought out. Again, no one disagrees with the first 5 points of regulation. Giving this industry over to a federally illegal one, is quite frankly disingenuous. The access limitation (price and location) would be severe. This bill seeks to punish the good actors, and provide additional greed to corporate owned marijuana conglomerates. If we are trying to keep intoxicating products out of the hands of children, and consumers safe, this isn't the proper way to effectuate that goal. This bill only serves to strip jobs and business, while stripping consumers of access and choice. Enact common sense legislation without being tricked into supporting a monopoly. I am happy to meet with you to supply more education and information. Thank you.

By legal, I do mean legal hemp derived products as defined in the 2018 Farm Hemp Bill. Before you roll your eyes at my testimony, please hear me out. I under the opposition of allowing these products to be sold freely in Missouri without regulation and I do agree that there should be some regulations. But putting a ban on the sale of these products by stores like myself is going to kill small business in Missouri and hurt a lot of families. A lot. My store is my sole income and it supports myself and my 4 children. In Missouri, cannabis is legal medically and recreationally. Dispensaries already own the market and our products are nothing compared to what is sold in dispensaries. For starters, our products are not being sold to minors like people in support of this bill make it seem. The pictures I've seen floating around in articles and news stories are Chinese packaging most usually found on the streets. Anyone can order that packaging and order drugs and cannabis off of WhatsApp, Telegram and other social media outlets and package it and resell it. I've seen it for years. But how many times have I seen that packaging in store? ZERO times. Businesses like mine are supporting families and we are putting our entire wellbeing at risk by selling products like that and selling to minors. Most of us vet our products before even putting on the shelves and I quarantee most of the store owners educate their customers about what they are buying. Also, the cannabis industry is behind a lot of these bans happening because stores like mine cut into their millions and millions of dollars of profits. The local dispensary in my town has spread rumors about my store to their customers for over a year now, telling their customers to stay away from me and my "unregulated products" because their "full of mold, arsenic and deadly chemicals". That is all hogwash. Missouri has made it to where an average Missourian can NOT afford a dispensary license and big canna from out of state have purchased the majority of them. Since there is a license cap, no one else has a way in. The micro license has proven to also be rigged, as you are well aware of all the scandals that have happened with license purchasing, etc. Let our businesses continue to sell these products but put some regulations on them. Let us apply for licenses just like alcohol and tobacco sales. Monitor us. We'll change the packaging. We'll make our stores 21+ only. But we need these products to stay in business. And it's not only that. Our products are more affordable by extreme margins to our customers. If you go to my local dispensary, you would spend double there than you would at my store. I cater to people living on fixed incomes and who just don't want to be tracked in dispensaries. You can't go to a dispensary and walk out with a product for under \$20, but you can in mine. We are HELPING people every single day. I, myself, am autoimmune and disabled, but still working and functioning off of products that I personally sell in my store. I relate to my customers and can help them afford an alternative medication. Please don't ban the products that are keeping my business alive. Please don't ban the products that are helping my community. Please don't kill small

business in Missouri. Let the dispensaries have their products and let us have ours. I am willing to bet that if you personally went to a majority of the stores in our state and talked to the owners, you would hear similar stories. My business is my life and I feel like it's on the line. I sold me house and property to open my store and this is heartbreaking knowing that I'm fighting for my business and customers AGAIN. Please help us. Let's put some regulations on the products and make sure we aren't selling to minors. But in my store, we sell to 21+, we vet our products and customers and we educate them properly. All of our products are in child proof packaging as well and I would love to have someone talk to me in person, if willing. Come see our side. It's not as bad a lobbyists make it out to be.

I OPPOSE HB 1781 as introduced. This bill threatens the existence and health of the hemp industry for non-psychoactive purposes. THC and CBD are not the same, and it's important to maintain a legal distinction between the 2 substances. No different than maintaining a legal distinction between heroin and poppyseed salad dressing, though both heroin and poppy seeds (yes, the same poppy seeds used on hamburger buns, bagels, cakes, and salad dressings) come from the same source (the poppy plant). In fact, the consumption of legal food products containing poppy seeds can cause a drug test to come back positive for heroin use. Using this analogy, THC is to heroin what CBD is to poppy seeds. Another analogy would be that THC is to alcoholic beer what CBD is to non-alcoholic beer. This bill would jeopardize the manufacture, sale, and use of THC-free CBD/hemp products in Missouri. THC is what causes problems, not CBD. And both have legitimate therapeutic medicinal benefits. This bill would create undue regulatory and financial burdens on hemp producers. Hemp has industrial purposes such as paper, bio-fuel, clothing, and building materials. This bill would throw the baby out with the bath water.

There is no consistency among stores regarding signage for selling to 21+. There is no consistency among stores regarding display of product. Some stores may have these products on open shelving, while other stores may have them in locked cases that require employee assistance. These intoxicating cannabinoids appear to be available in multiple forms including: vapes, flavored vapes, gummies, edibles, loose bud, concentrates, bottles, mints or pre-rolled products
