I SUPPORT HB 1795While I support this bill as both originally written (with the 7:00pm provision struck out) and with the 7:00pm provision remaining in tact, I would prefer to see the 7:00pm provision struck out and changed to 10:00pm. If students can attend school sponsored athletic games, practices, and other after-school activities that extend past 7:00pm during the week, then there is absolutely no good reason why they can't work past 7:00pm during the week so long as they have their parent's permission. In regard to the federal regulation that prohibits students from working past 7:00pm, Missouri hasn't let federal law stop us from passing state legislation that is in opposition to federal law before, and I don't think we should start now. The legalization of marijuana in Missouri is a great example of this. Missouri should pass legislation that's best for Missourians, regardless of what the federal government thinks. In cases like this where federal law is more restrictive than proposed Missouri law, individuals and businesses should be able to decide for themselves the level of risk they're willing to assume. The Missouri legislature should not water down legislation in an effort to make that decision for us.
