To the Members of the House Special Committee on Homeland Security: I am writing to express my strong opposition to House Bills 2367, 2470, and 2523, which are scheduled for a hearing on February 12th before the Missouri House Special Committee on Homeland Security. As the founder of Revolucion Educativa, an organization committed to empowering the Latino community on education issues, I am deeply concerned about the potential consequences of these bills on immigrant communities in Missouri.First and foremost, these bills suffer from serious constitutional defects, similar to those recently challenged in Texas. The Supremacy Clause of the U.S. Constitution clearly assigns matters related to immigration and foreign commerce to the federal government, and any state action in this area must yield to federal jurisdiction. The U.S. Department of Justice has already filed a lawsuit against Texas for unconstitutional legislation targeting immigrants, and it is imperative that Missouri lawmakers consult with legal experts before proceeding with similar bills. Furthermore, these bills would allocate resources to matters that are already addressed by existing law or fall under the exclusive jurisdiction of the federal government. By adding additional penalties for offenses already covered by federal law, these bills not only duplicate existing punishment but also risk further marginalizing immigrant communities in Missouri. Additionally, criminalizing conduct that is already subject to federal law could lead to costly litigation and unnecessary strain on our state's resources. Given the existing punishment for the underlying offenses, the exclusive jurisdiction of the federal government in matters of immigration law, and the potential for expensive court litigation, the costs associated with these bills far outweigh any perceived benefits. I urge you to carefully consider the implications of HBs 2367, 2470, and 2523 and to prioritize the well-being and rights of all residents of Missouri, including immigrants and their families. Thank you for considering my concerns. I respectfully request that you oppose these bills and work towards policies that promote justice, equality, and inclusion for all members of our community.

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SERIOUS PROBLEMS WITH HBs 2367, 2470 and 25230n February 12th the Missouri House Special Committee on Homeland Security hasscheduled a hearing on HBs 2367, 2470 and 2523. All of these bills have seriousproblems that legislators must consider. Constitutional Defects - These bills are inspired by actions that Governor Abbot and the State of Texas has taken recently and suffer from similar Constitutional defects.- Supremacy Clause. Among other things, Texas has passed laws authorizing arrestfor "illegal entry" and "refusal to comply with order" to return to country of origin. The U.S. Department of Justice has responded by suing Texas, partly by noting thatthe U.S. Constitution assigns all matters related to immigration and foreign commerce to the federal government and that state action in this area must yield tothe exclusive jurisdiction of the federal government. See https://www.justice.gov/opa/pr/justice-department-files-lawsuit-against-state-texasregardingunconstitutional-sb-4- Equal Protection and Due process. Other Plaintiffs have sued Texas on othergrounds. For example, the American Civil Liberties Union and other nongovernmentalorganizations have sued Texas for discriminating on the basis ofnational origin and ethnicity in its trespass laws and for vague and procedurallydefective statutory language.RECOMMENDATION: Consult the Department of Justice and Constitutional expertsbefore proceeding with these bills. Two of these bills have fiscal notes which do notconsider the cost of defending these bills in the courts.Cost/Benefit Calculation - These bills would devote the resources of prosecutors, public defenders, police, correctional personnel, etc. to matters that either are alreadyaddressed by existing law or appear intended to punish conduct under the exclusive jurisdiction of the federal government.- All three bills add a second offense when a defendant is guilty of an initial offense. So, punishment already exists in law for the initial offense. Where is the data that justifies new penalties for the same conduct when committed by an "illegal alien?" When "illegal aliens" are arrested for the initial offense, it is likely that they alreadywill experience greater difficulty than other defendants in matters such as bail, sentencing, probation, etc. Of course, a state court conviction of the initial offensecould have detrimental consequences for the convicted person under federalimmigration laws. Why should Missouri add a second offense when matters such asillegal entry, refusal to comply with a court order, harboring, etc. already are coveredunder federal law?- All three bills would criminalize conduct already subject to federal law. For example, HB2367 basically criminalizes trespass in Missouri "for violation of 8 USC 1325 or 8USC 1326." These statutes deal with unlawful entry and reentry. It is clear that a Missouri court has no jurisdiction to address a violation of a federal criminal statute. Yet, that is exactly what HB2367 expressly requires. HB2523 has the similar defect.HB2470 criminalizes illegal entry, refusal to comply with a court order to return to aforeign nation, concealment or harboring, etc., all of which encroach on federalcrimes for the same conduct.RECOMMENDATION: Considering the existing punishment for the underlying offense, the exclusive jurisdiction of the federal government to punish the proposed newsecond offenses, the apparent lack of data suggesting

Missouri has a significant problem requiring the attention of Missouri law enforcement, and the likelihood of expensive court litigation, the cost of these three bills seems to vastly outweigh any perceived benefit.

Since our inception, Empower Missouri has focused on the criminal justice system and its impacts. Our Community Justice Coalition consists of community advocates and organizations from across the state who work with those who have been impacted by the criminal justice system. Many coalition members are formerly incarcerated or have currently incarcerated loved ones, and all are connected by a vision for a future without mass incarceration. HB 2470 would create multiple new felonies, including: a felony of criminal trespassing for any person who does something in violation of a state law or a county or municipal ordinance and is undocumented; a felony for "concealing, harboring, or shielding" a person who is undocumented; a felony for encouraging a person who is undocumented to come to Missouri. It would also offer protections to any local or state government official, employee, or contractor who carries out these provisions in violation of federal law. We are opposed to this bill as it creates a double punishment. Immigrants in our communities who experience even the slightest brush with the law can find themselves subject to detention for an undetermined period, after which they are expelled from the country and barred from returning. We are also opposed to the immunity clauses included in this bill, which open up our state to prolonged, expensive litigation. Immigration enforcement is the federal government's job. What HB 2470 is attempting to do is to step into the federal government's shoes and determine whether a person is able to remain in the United States. The Supremacy Clause of the Constitution preempts state action where federal law expressly or impliedly precludes state action. Laws that conflict, or stand as an obstacle to the enforcement of federal immigration laws and policy, are invalid under the preemption doctrine. State and local governments cannot cite the failure of the federal government to pass comprehensive immigration reform as the rationale for adopting unconstitutional state immigration laws. State and local government officials, employees, and contractors are immune from any liability in carrying out these provisions, which should be a cause of concern for all Missourians. There is no monetary limit on indemnity for state officials, and they will also be represented by the Attorney General, which means that Missourians will be bankrolling government officials who violate the Constitution of the United States of America. Adoption of state and local criminal laws against undocumented immigrants has often been driven by misleading rhetoric about "criminal aliens," as well as by reliance on inaccurate statistics suggesting that all undocumented immigrants are criminals or a dangerous threat to communities. Local and state officials also often misunderstand the nature of the criminal provisions in federal immigration law. In fact, mere unlawful presence in the United States has never

been a crime. When considering immigration reform legislation in 2005, Congress specifically rejected a provision that would have made unlawful presence in the United States a federal crime. Entering the United States without being inspected and admitted is a misdemeanor, but many undocumented immigrants do not enter the United States illegally. They enter legally but overstay, work without authorization, drop out of school, or violate the conditions of their visas in some other way. Mere undocumented presence in the United States alone, in the absence of a previous removal order and unauthorized reentry, is not a crime under federal law. Why are we treating it as such? Use of law enforcement resources to target undocumented immigrants may have serious consequences for public safety. Given the evidence that immigrants are less likely to commit crimes than other residents of the United States, law enforcement may find itself targeting a generally law-abiding population at the expense of investigating serious property and violent crimes. Additionally, state and county correctional facilities face severe understaffing, and any additional strain on the population of state prisons and county jails would be detrimental to the operation of these facilities. Public safety resources should not be diverted to enforce this law, which is in conflict with federal precedent. For these reasons, we urge the committee to oppose HB 2470. 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Representatives.I am aware that a number of members on this committee are Christians, as am I. As a Christian, I must urge you to oppose all the bills being discussed today. When Jesus tells the parable of the sheep and the goats, he says that "whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me...whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me." The "least of these" refers to the vulnerable, such as the undocumented immigrants of 2024 Missouri. In the parable, Jesus aligns himself with the vulnerable. Undocumented immigrants are people who were forced to make the difficult choice to leave their homes and live in a constant state of uncertainty, just so they can survive and feed their families. Wheat ever we do, or advocate to have done, or legislate to have done to the undocumented people of Missouri, we are doing, advocating have have done, and legislating to have done to Christ himself.Similarly, the parable of the Good Samaritan shows us plainly how we are expected to treat the people around us. That story was not shocking because it was a stranger helping a stranger. It was shocking because it was about a Samaritan helping a Jewish man. These were two men who were supposed to hate, fear, and distrust one another. They would have been taught by everyone in their societies--political leaders, families, religious leaders, etc..-to hate one another from birth. Yet Jesus says that those are the very people we are supposed to care for in their times of need. There are many voices telling Americans to hate, fear, and distrust undocumented immigrants. The message of Christ is clearly in opposition to this. These bills, if passed, would rip apart families. HB 2470 particularly, would make it difficult for nonprofit workers to serve in their communities. Serving an undocumented person would put a worker at risk of being charged with a class A felony. That would be a punishment on par with murder, kidnapping, and child molestation. All for helping a neighbor--which Christ commanded us to do. All the bills being discussed in this hearing will make life more difficult and uncertain for people in an already precarious situation. It will also stir up even more negative feelings toward them in the general public. That is not in line with the teachings of Christ. In fact, it is in direct opposition to his teachings. I urge you to carefully consider this. Pray about it, open your heart to what the Lord has to say on the matter. There are also many practical issues to consider on this topic. Undocumented immigrants commit crimes at a far lower rate than native born citizens. Increases in the undocumented population have no effect on crime. "Safety" is not a real reason to try and drive undocumented people from our state. Additionally, undocumented people paid over \$49 million dollars in state and local taxes in MO in 2021. They contribute heavily to our state's economy and function. These bills are bad for Missourians and counter to the teachings of Christ. HB 2470 would create a new felony offense that targets undocumented immigrants and severely increases penalties, including the threat of deportation, for otherwise minor offenses or infractions. In the proposed legislation, it is unclear how the "discovery" of citizenship would be conducted or confirmed, opening the door for increased discrimination and racial profiling in Missouri.
