In my work on "May Contain: My Life," a docudrama series that delves into the complex and often

This legislation is not merely regulatory—it's a lifeline for families and a testament to what can be achieved when grief is channeled into advocacy. By endorsing Elijah's Law, we have the opportunity to prevent future tragedies and ensure that no other family has to endure the loss of a child due to a lack of awareness or preparedness in managing food allergies. The stories of Jerome Bettis, August Maturo, Ava Kolker, and many others featured in "May Contain: My Life" serve to elevate the conversation around food allergies from individual concerns to a collective societal responsibility. However, it's the activism of Dina Hawthorn and Thomas Silvera that embodies the spirit of this legislation-turning personal loss into a nationwide call for action. To the legislators of Missouri, I urge you to recognize the significance of Elijah's Law and the impact it can have on the lives of children with food allergies in our state. Let's honor the memory of Elijah and the advocacy work of his parents by making Missouri a safer place for all children. By enacting this law, we not only protect our most vulnerable citizens but also affirm our commitment to a more inclusive, aware, and compassionate society.

I fully support HB2552. Suggest some changes to better align, with Elijahs Law providing thorough protection for infants and toddlers with food allergies.Firstly I propose including a requirement for training for childcare providers. This training should emphasize recognizing signs in infants and toddlers empowering caregivers to respond promptly to emergencies.Secondly I recommend adding emergency protocols to the bill. These protocols should detail guidelines for administering epinephrine auto injectors in emergency situations involving infants and toddlers with allergies. They should also cover storage and maintenance of epinephrine auto injectors for young children to ensure preparedness in responding effectively to allergic reactions.Incorporating these amendments into HB2552 will strengthen the bills effectiveness, in protecting the health of our community members.
