I am writing as a Resident of Greene County, Missouri for the past two years, and also a resident born and raised in the Ozarks of Missouri. I appreciate the opportunity to present this written testimony. A recent graduate of the New School, and a long time White European American working in community organizing alongside the Asian Community Development Council: I am formally trained in diversity studies and well-equipped to speak on the issue of this abbreviated house action - a mere matter of 'expenditure' the Republicans would suggest: designed to obliterate statewide justice, equity, diversity and inclusion initiatives, and further demoralize queer, trans, Black, migrant and other usually protected Missourians swiftly and uniformly. This is an enormous rollback of civil rights through brevity of language, density of thought and pure slight of hand. I am writing to testify against the blatant state overreach in regulating and rolling back the Missouri ideals of justice, equity, diversity and inclusion. It shocks the conscience that these series of House Bills 2365, 2448, 2569, and 2619; each identical, each less than 225 words, would be so blatantly an attack on what we observe as fundamental and federal level human and civil rights protections. These bills have the audacity to outline traditionally protected classes of people at the state and federal level, 'group of individuals based on race, color, religion, sex, gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, national origin, or ancestry' (6-7), and then disavows these groups of any such rights and social advances as the bill contends and disavows 'the concept that disparities between groups are solely the result of oppression' (8-9) -a nearly unutterable concept, and a complete rewriting of history. A vicious lie that is held up on the backs of dead Missourians of marginalized identities -marginal by the measure of this bill, only a matter of cost, a simple expenditure. I certainly cannot allow this subversion of justice to go unnoticed in my written testimony. A child of Missouri, I am acutely aware of the 'short hand' deceit of this bill shown on full display. It parallels a lofty legal term and social good promise: 'intersectional' as an equal to 'divisive identity activism' (4). This is hate tactics on the sly. It does away with protections and funding for the most diverse among Missouri, and then jests existing protections will somehow remain.If the Missouri Republican attack machine is so inclined to refute justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion as inalienable and deliverable, then they should at least provide a counter argument. Representatives Richey, Hudson, Baker and Smith. You should be forced to defend your cultural choice to foreclose on culture in less than 225 words, in strategically insincere bills; give us your impassioned plea for your radical position at least, instead of condensed bullet-points of oppression. You are not clever by omission; though you may hope to be, and I call on the Minority Democrat Leaders, and Moderate Republicans to meet these bills with swift defeat, or no introduction at all. Don't sell hate to the people of Missouri on the cheap, they deserve better. Speaking in St. Louis in 1964, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said: "Let us not seek to satisfy our thirst for freedom by drinking from the cup of bitterness and hatred. We must forever conduct our struggle on the high plane of dignity and discipline." These bills are tantamount to physical violence, attacking the oppressed, dismissing their

historic oppression, and over two decades of serious academic work and research on diversity initiatives. These bills look to undo this work and denounce diversity and DEI as niche -or worse. As Dr. King continued: "We must rise to the majestic heights of meeting physical force with soul force." To the Republican few, we see these attacks, and the attacks of the past years, and weeks -for what they are, attacks against the bodies and souls of the LGBTQ+, minority and ethnic communities of Missouri -and the time for silence is long past. Even as you posit 'expenditure' to repel basic human considerations and rights, and use brevity as your silence to hope no is listening. As a community, the LGBTQ+ community meets you with every resource at our disposal, and it must begin with that soulful call for justice, equity, diversity and inclusion found in the Missouri State Constitution. These bills' explicit, abbreviated and emboldened attacks on a diverse society of Missourians reeks of the ancient (and returning) racist and punitive laws that sought to regulate these same exemplars -usually migrants- as outliers, simply by defining them as such, as Other. These bills want to avoid the unpleasant truths of history and redress sins by pretending they never were committed, and wipe out justice for diverse individuals in the process. Say no to these bills. Say no to these rollbacks. Say no to the politics of hate on the sly. Say no to these few Republican's tricks, of less than 225 words -225 words that are destructive in their construction, and require every single breathing, soul-bearing person to pay close scrutiny to today, so they never become law, even slyly -sly in their construction, sly in their language -but devastating in their impact on community resiliency and to maintain equitable outcomes in basic service areas including child and healthcare. Say no to HB 2569. It might be appealing, to some, to want to attack what some have made dizzying buzzwords; diversity, DEI, etc. It is more difficult to lift up those who are different from us, protecting the most vulnerable amongst us, addressing the heart of diversity -not the simplified and denied version available in these bills meant to foreclose on those who call out for justice and equity. Certainly, I hear their cries -you should too, and vote no on these egregious rollbacks to justice and equity, and decency. I will close with a quote by James Baldwin, and let it speak to those who would play so slyly with the bodies of the LGBTQ+ community and other marginalized communities: ""People who treat other people as less than human must not be surprised when the bread they have cast on the waters comes floating back to them, poisoned." Say no to HB 2569.

I am opposed to HB 2365, HB 2448, HB 2560 (withdrawn), and HB 2619, All of these bills reflect a fundamental misunderstanding of diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) concepts and the benefits of DEI for organizations. My testimony will clarify what DEI means and how it can benefit Missouri state government and the citizens of Missouri which the state government serves. Why is DEI important to Missouri state government?It is a way to attract and keep top talent. It is a tool to make employees feel valued, welcome, and respected. What is DEI (Diversity, Equity, Inclusion)? What is diversity? Diversity means a wide and varied range of groups within a community or population, in this case the workforce of the state of Missouri. Examples of diversity include ethnicity, religion, abilities, and sexual orientation. What is equity? Equity means the fair and just treatment of all members of the community or population, in this case, the workforce of the state of Missouri, regardless of how they identify. What is inclusion? DEI initiatives are necessary precisely because of the attitude of fear of change underlying this bill. Marginalized communities are stepping away from the edges and asking for seat at the table. It is not lost on me that the sponsor of this bill and the others like it are middle-aged middle/upper class white males. Of course you don't understand the need for diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives, but I encourage you to open your eyes. Being "woke" isn't really any more than understanding and enlightenment. Meritocracy only works if the playing field starts out level in access. Once access is opened equitably, then succeeding on one's merits is possible. I find it troubling that it is automatically assumed that people in marginalized classes are assumed to be less qualified. What if, and think about this, what IF, there have been MORE qualified individuals in marginalized communities but we missed their brilliance because their access was limited and their "spot" went to a less qualified person in the ruling class? We are not born knowing everything, and DEI programs help folks navigate the nuances of collegiality in ever growing diverse workspaces and learning environments. What some call WOKE, others call common courtesy and decency. There are no "thought police" so people are able to think whatever they want. They might not be able to say whatever they want at work/school. Sometimes common decency is using someone's authentic pronouns. The vague language of "other initiatives" is concerning in that it could jeopardize compliance with federal programs like Title III which governs ESL students. Can DESE complete intradepartmental cultural competency programs to train districts and/or provide resources on their online platforms paid for with government tax dollars? Missouri will move closer to the finish line in the race to the bottom if this discriminatory bill is passed. Brain drain is real. Licensures will be in jeopardy. It boils down to this: this bill doesn't stop discrimination; it perpetuates it.

I am submitting my testimony today in opposition to HB 2365. I am currently an instructor at the college level, and I teach courses about community engagement and design. In my courses, it is critical that students learn the context and the skills to understand people's experiences that are different than theirs — I focus much of my instruction on supporting students to build social empathy. the ability to deeply understand people by perceiving not only their life situation, but also the structural systems that have led to that situation. Without the skills and knowledge to understand and learn about other people's different experiences, there is no way to design systems and solutions that will begin to address the problems we face in Missouri. I have regularly supported students to access programming related to understanding difference (diversity), learning how to respond to difference in group settings (inclusion), and seeking to not have identity be a predictor of outcomes (equity). I've found that students who have the opportunity to learn about these concepts in a variety of settings, including through school and other settings, are able to be better collaborators and problem solvers, working towards addressing the challenges we face in Missouri, including poverty, poor health outcomes, and poor quality of life. Removing access to these programs would hinder our ability to move forward as a state. In addition, I run a small business that does consulting work with government and non-profit partners. Myself, and my other colleagues in consulting to government, regularly prioritize equity the idea that people do not all start from the same place, and may need different approaches to address their needs — as that is the reality of people's experiences. Limiting our ability to do the work supporting government to make Missouri better and more efficient is counterproductive and limiting to small business.

Due to structural racism and implicit bias in medicine, the closure of seven rural hospitals in MO since 2014 and a growing number of people falling in the Medicaid gap, the maternal and infant mortality rates in MO continue to rank both nationally and internationally. These bills are dangerous- and blatantly disregard every recommendation, including our state's own maternal and infant mortality review board's recommendation, for addressing those deep disparities in health and economic outcomes based on race, ethnicity, and gender. Make no mistake, every single Missourian no matter their race, ethnicity, or gender, would feel the negative impacts of these bills. I am so tired of the Missouri Legislature wasting time and resources on racist, hateful, fear-based bills that do nothing to promote the welfare of Missourians.



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I am testifying in opposition to House Bills 2365, 2448, 2567, 2567, and 2619. These bills, as written. conflict with the 2021 American Association of Colleges of Nursing, which outlines the Essential Standards (Essential Standards) for Professional Nursing Practice. The Essential Standards for Nursing Education Programs across the country identify Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion as a basic concept for nursing practice. The Commission on Collegiate Education, the major accrediting body for nursing education, expects that nursing education programs adhere to the Essential Standards. The Essentials, as well as the Standards for Nurse Practitioner Education, identify diversity, equity, inclusion, and social determinants of health, along with health equity, as essential curricular components. Whether colleges like it or not, they have no choice but to follow these guidelines. A major concern with this legislation is that many of the prohibitions that would be put in place are in direct violation of the guidelines being mandated by the professional associations and accreditation agencies. Additionally, the Joint Commission on Accreditation for healthcare organizations, in its new requirements effective Jan 01, 2023, requires its accredited organizations to "identify healthcare disparities in its patient population by stratifying quality and safety data using the sociodemographic characteristics of the organization's patients, namely by age, gender, preferred language, race, and ethnicity. Students must be taught to do this.Regarding admissions: Schools need to be able to consider other factors that can demonstrate a student's ability. The trend in higher education has been to move toward test-optional for admissions into academic programs since it is recognized that a single test is not the best measure of a student's performance and ability to succeed. Schools need to be able to consider other factors that can demonstrate a student's ability. Contrary to what many believe, the holistic admissions review process does not lower academic standards. It is a race-neutral practice that examines prospective students' noncognitive, contextual, experiential, and academic factors when making admission decisions. During this review process, each applicant is considered individually and holistically. The holistic admissions review is a fair practice that looks at all students, not just minority students, non-cognitive factors (leadership, resilience, grit). It provides context for how individuals demonstrate success outside of traditional metrics of the standard grade point average and standardized tests. The practice considers each student individually on all pertinent factors regarding their ability to succeed at the institution, to thrive, and contribute to learning to and from peers and contribute to the campus community. Wouldn't we want this for all students?Lastly. health equity simply means every Missourian has a fair and just opportunity to be as healthy as possible. Who would not want that for Missouri citizens? The social determinants of health mean that the conditions where people live, learn, work, and play can impact their health. If you live in a home with lead-based paint, the children are likely to have toxic lead levels or if you live in an environment with pollutants, the families may be prone to asthma. Healthcare providers must understand how environments affect health to provide the necessary healthcare. Understanding environments is

critical to appropriate health screening and healthcare and this information is gained through learning about the social determinants of health.



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DEI training and policy allows my workplace and many others to be a balanced, fair, and more impactful part of our community. Punishing that, restricting it, or putting barriers to it will continue to divide our community.



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House Bill 2569 attempts to "defund" Planned Parenthood and discriminate against Missouri patients who rely on publicly funded health care, like Medicaid, by blocking them from using their health insurance for preventive services at any health center affiliated with an abortion provider. This is a direct attack on Planned Parenthood and the patients who trust and rely on Planned Parenthood for their health care. Missouri communities already face extreme disparities in access to health care. These attacks strain our state's overstretched health care safety net, defy federal law and the Missouri Supreme Court, and jeopardize federal funding for Missouri's entire Medicaid program. Barring Medicaid patients from choosing Planned Parenthood for health care services violates Medicaid's "free choice of provider" requirement, a federal law that says patients have the right to choose their own health care provider. Violating the "free choice of provider" requirement puts Missouri at risk of losing all federal Medicaid dollars.Let's be clear: Saying this is about abortion is disingenuous. This is about Missourians' access to birth control, cancer screenings, annual exams, and STI testing and treatment. Not abortion, HB 2569, like all attempts to "defund" Planned Parenthood, are designed to score political points by targeting Planned Parenthood. This is cruel and irresponsible.HB 2569 is aimed at one thing: politicizing Planned Parenthood, at the expense of Missouri patients' access to birth control, cancer screenings, STI testing and treatment, and other non-abortion health care.Planned Parenthood health centers are integral to Missouri's health care safety net. Missouri's safety net cannot keep up without Planned Parenthood health centers, which provide high-quality health care that is both accessible and comprehensive to thousands of patients a year. Planned Parenthood of the St. Louis Region and Southwest Missouri (PPSLRSWMO) and Planned Parenthood Great Plains (PPGP) health centers provide expert, high-quality sexual and reproductive health care, including cancer screenings and the full range of birth control options. Nearly 20% of both PPSLRSWMO's and PPGP's Missouri health center patients rely on Medicaid for their care coverage. Planned Parenthood serves 52% of all family planning patients who rely on Title X, The Right Time, and Medicaid providers in the Missouri Family Health Council's (MFHC) family planning network. Any suggestion that Missouri's health care infrastructure can support these displaced patients is simply wrong — there aren't enough sexual and reproductive health care providers to fill the gap. Attacking Planned Parenthood services will disproportionately hurt Missouri communities who are already facing disparities in access to health care, in addition to the pandemic. Missouri has a statewide and ongoing syphilis outbreak. The number of early syphilis cases in Missouri increased 259% between 2015 and 2021. Planned Parenthood has ramped up testing for syphilis and provided treatment for patients. Missouri's maternal mortality rate is increasing, and parts of the state have infant mortality rates higher than those in developing countries. Black women in Missouri are three to four times more likely than white women to die from preventable

pregnancy complications. Politicians know exactly who they're going after — women and people of color who disproportionately rely on publicly funded programs like Medicaid. Access to preventive care is more critical than ever in this post-Roe world. Denying people access to Planned Parenthood's services will irresponsibly worsen public health disparities. Despite repeated legislative efforts to "defund" Planned Parenthood and discriminate against patients by preventing them from choosing their own health care providers, Planned Parenthood continues to offer vital preventive care to Missourians. These attacks on Missouri's health care safety net are not sustainable. This is the time to expand access to care, not block patients from getting birth control, cancer screenings, annual exams, and STI testing and treatment at Planned Parenthood.

I am writing to express my deep concern over the proposed anti-diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) legislation and its potential impacts on the state of Missouri—spanning economic repercussions, healthcare outcomes, and the overall well-being of our communities, as a dedicated healthcare professional who has witnessed firsthand the transformative power of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) initiatives in both educational and healthcare settings. My testimony is grounded in my commitment to preparing the next generation of nurses to provide compassionate, competent, and equitable care to all individuals, regardless of their background, race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, or socioeconomic status. The Critical Role of DEI in Nursing Education and Healthcare: In nursing education, DEI initiatives are not optional extras; they are essential to preparing competent, empathetic healthcare professionals capable of serving Missouri's diverse population. These programs enhance understanding, promote empathy, and ensure our graduates are equipped to provide highquality care to all patients, irrespective of their backgrounds. In addition, The American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN), the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN), Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), the National League for Nursing Commission for Nursing Education Accreditation (NLN CNEA) the Association of the American Medical Colleges (AAMC), and the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) are just a few of the national organizations/regulatory bodies that establish the guidelines for our education frameworks. These organizations have core domains and competencies that must be taught in our programs or risk losing accreditation. This is not up to state legislation to decide. Cultivating Empathy and Understanding: Nursing is fundamentally about caring for people. DEI initiatives in nursing education are critical in cultivating empathy, understanding, and the ability to provide culturally competent care. These initiatives prepare our students to meet the diverse needs of the communities they will serve, promoting health equity and improving patient outcomes. Enhancing Team Collaboration: DEI initiatives foster an environment where diverse

perspectives are valued, leading to innovative problem-solving and enhanced team collaboration. In healthcare, where teamwork is paramount, the ability to work effectively in diverse teams can be the difference between life and death.Addressing Health Disparities: By incorporating DEI principles into our curriculum, we prepare our students to recognize and address health disparities. This is crucial for the advancement of public health and for ensuring that all individuals, regardless of their background, have access to high-quality healthcare.Reflecting Population Diversity: Our nursing workforce should reflect the diversity of its population. DEI initiatives in nursing education are essential for attracting and retaining students from underrepresented groups in the nursing profession, thereby enriching the profession and enhancing the quality of care provided to diverse populations. Concerns Regarding Anti -DEI Legislation: The proposed anti-DEI legislation threatens to undermine these crucial efforts by restricting the ability of educational institutions to teach and promote the values of diversity, equity, and inclusion. Such restrictions could have a chilling effect on academic freedom, stifle the development of a culturally competent healthcare workforce, and exacerbate the health disparities that we, as healthcare professionals, have been working tirelessly to eliminate. Economic Implications of Anti-DEI Legislation: The economic implications of restricting DEI initiatives extend beyond the immediate healthcare sector, potentially affecting Missouri's broader economic landscape. A diverse and inclusive workforce is key to innovation and economic growth. Research has consistently shown that diverse teams are more creative, solve problems more effectively, and are better at identifying and entering new markets. The proposed legislation risks stifling these benefits by undermining DEI initiatives, potentially leading to a less dynamic and competitive economy. Moreover, the healthcare sector, a significant contributor to Missouri's economy, relies on a diverse workforce to address the complex health needs of its population. Limiting DEI efforts could exacerbate workforce shortages, particularly in underserved areas, leading to increased healthcare costs and decreased economic productivity due to poor health outcomes. Restricting DEI initiatives risks Missouri's economic vitality. Diverse and inclusive workforces drive innovation, with McKinsey & Company (2015) reporting that companies with diverse executive teams outperform their peers in profitability by up to 35%. The proposed legislation threatens to undermine this advantage, potentially leading to a significant brain drain as highly skilled talent opts for more inclusive regions. This could be detrimental to healthcare and across all industries vital to Missouri's economy. Projected Economic Loss: Quantifying the exact economic loss over the next ten years due to the absence of DEI initiatives is challenging due to the myriad factors influencing economic outcomes. However, we can estimate the potential impact by considering the role of DEI in workforce productivity and innovation. If DEI policies contribute to a 5-10% increase in workforce productivity and innovation—a conservative estimate based on numerous studies—the economic loss to Missouri could be substantial. For illustration, if Missouri's GDP were to grow at an expected rate of 2% annually over the next ten years without DEI initiatives, incorporating the effects of reduced productivity and innovation could lower this growth rate to 1.5% or less. Using Missouri's 2020 GDP of approximately \$300 billion as a baseline, even a 0.5% reduction in growth rate could result in a cumulative loss of over \$15 billion in economic output over the next decade.Again, I want to emphasize this point: The absence of robust DEI initiatives could conservatively lower Missouri's economic growth rate by 0.5% annually over the next decade, translating to a cumulative economic output loss of over \$15 billion. This estimate underscores the importance of DEI in maintaining and enhancing our state's economic competitiveness and prosperity. The ability of Missouri to attract and retain highly skilled talent is crucial for its economic vitality across all sectors, including healthcare, technology, education, and manufacturing. DEI initiatives are pivotal in creating an inclusive and supportive environment that appeals to a diverse workforce. A 2020 report by McKinsey & Company highlights that companies with ethnic and gender diversity in their executive teams were 36% and 25% more likely to outperform their peers in profitability, respectively. This underscores the link between diversity and superior financial performance. Failure to foster an inclusive environment due to restrictive DEI policies can significantly impact Missouri's competitiveness. Highly skilled professionals, particularly those from underrepresented groups, may choose to relocate to more inclusive regions, taking their talent, innovation potential, and economic contributions with them. This brain drain can lead to a shortage of skilled workers, stifle innovation, and slow economic growth.Impact on Healthcare Outcomes: The proposed legislation also stands to worsen healthcare outcomes. DEI initiatives are crucial for addressing health disparities and ensuring equitable healthcare delivery. Research indicates that racial and ethnic minority groups in the U.S. face higher rates of morbidity and mortality compared to their white counterparts. For example, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports that Black Americans have a 30% higher death rate from heart disease than white Americans (CDC, 2020). Additionally, a lack of cultural competency among healthcare providers can lead to miscommunication, mistrust, and underutilization of healthcare services, exacerbating these disparities. A study published in the Journal of Nursing Management found that DEI training for nursing and healthcare staff significantly improved patient satisfaction scores, particularly among minority patients (Journal of Nursing Management, 2019). With

the ability to educate future nurses and healthcare professionals on cultural competency, we can avoid perpetuating inequities in health access and outcomes, leading to poorer overall health for Missouri's population. Addressing the Economic and Social Costs of Healthcare Disparities in Missouri: Healthcare disparities present a pressing challenge within Missouri, mirroring national trends that inflict significant economic and social burdens. These disparities, stemming from unequal access to healthcare, variable quality of medical services, and the broader determinants of health, notably impact the well-being of Missourians across various communities. Economic Implications: Heightened Medical Costs: Health inequities lead to increased utilization of healthcare services, such as emergency visits and hospitalizations, particularly among marginalized groups. Although specific Missouri data is essential for precise analysis, national insights from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) suggest that minimizing health disparities for minority populations could substantially reduce healthcare expenditures. This pattern is echoed in Missouri, emphasizing the critical need for focused efforts to bridge these gaps.. **Reduced Productivity: The broader** economic impact of health disparities extends beyond direct healthcare spending to include lost productivity due to illness, disability, and premature mortality. As noted by the Economic Policy Institute (EPI), the cumulative economic burden of these disparities nationally is profound, with Missouri undoubtedly experiencing its share of this economic strain. Enhancing health equity is thus a moral obligation and an economic imperative for the state. Social Considerations: **Impaired** Quality of Life: Disparities in health outcomes diminish the quality of life for many individuals, manifesting in poorer health statuses and shortened life expectancies among disadvantaged populations. While detailed state-specific statistics would offer a clearer picture, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) findings on racial and ethnic health disparities reflect similar challenges within Missouri, underscoring the urgency of addressing these issues. Exacerbated Inequalities: The persistence of healthcare disparities amplifies existing social and economic inequalities, perpetuating a cycle of disadvantage across generations. Proactively tackling these health disparities is vital for fostering social justice and promoting a more equitable society in Missouri.Illustrative Insight:Reflecting on the broader national context, where racial and ethnic minorities disproportionately suffer from chronic conditions like diabetes and hypertension. Missouri stands to benefit significantly from initiatives aimed at reducing health disparities. By focusing on equitable disease management and prevention, the state can improve health outcomes for its residents and alleviate the associated healthcare costs, marking a stride towards both economic savings and enhanced public health. Urgent Call for Action: Given these considerations, it is imperative that the Missouri House of Representatives understands the broader implications of anti-DEI legislation. Not only does such legislation threaten the integrity of nursing education and the quality of healthcare delivery, but it also poses significant risks to the economic well-being of our state and the health outcomes of our population. I urge you to consider the long-term economic and social benefits of DEI initiatives and oppose any legislation restricting our ability to foster an inclusive, equitable, and prosperous Missouri. As a nurse and an educator, it is my duty to serve the best interests of my patients and students, as it is your sworn duty to act in the best interest of all Missourians by promoting policies that support diversity, equity, and inclusion- instead of political ideology.
