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Missouri is one of only 2 states which still uses gas chambers to induce the death of dogs and cats (WY is the other), meaning 48 other states recognize that this process is a cruel way to end a dog or cat's life (OH and UT passed bans within past 2 years). There is currently 1 gas chamber we are aware of still operating in MO (Poplar Bluff). However, with over 100 shelters/rescues in the state, we are unsure if other shelters may still have gas chambers installed but not currently in use. The process for inducing the death of a dog via gas chamber has been recorded to take over 30 minutes at times and has even been unsuccessful after multiple attempts. (see links below). It is a process of suffocation in which animals are oftentimes in significant distress barking, howling, convulsing, gasping for air, etc. The mental toll on those who must induce death this way cannot be understated. While it is always a difficult process to euthanize an animal, doing so in this way is especially tough as the animals die more slowly and possibly experience the symptoms listed above. Here is a quote from a Moberly shelter worker who had to use their now uninstalled chamber, "She said it was an unpleasantly memorable experience. (The dog) was just scrambling in there and gasping for air. Then it finally collapsed and was knocked unconscious, but it didn't die for about 10 minutes," she said. Animals have been pronounced dead and even thrown in freezers after being put through a gas chamber, only to be discovered alive later. Gas chambers can pose threats to people as well. The suffocating gas can leak, causing long-term damage to those who inhale excess amounts of carbon monoxide. Additionally, there has been an explosion due to a poorly maintained chamber in North Carolina. Over 3,000 shelters across the country complete the euthanasia process without usage of gas chambers, there is no reason our state should continue to allow usage when almost every other shelter in the country has figured out how to humanely euthanize animals. The AVMA standards released in 2020 state, "Consequently, CO (and CO2) is acceptable with conditions for use in institutional situations where appropriately designed and maintained equipment and trained and monitored personnel are available to administer it, but it is not recommended for routine euthanasia of cats and dogs. It may be considered in unusual or rare circumstances, such as natural disasters and large-scale disease outbreaks. Alternate methods with fewer conditions and disadvantages are recommended for companion animals where feasible."
