While we currently run a program to assist low-income families with the purchasing of hearing aids, we are only able to assist approximately 35-40 people a year. We are often restrained by rules of our program funding leaving				

approximately 35-40 people a year. We are often restrained by rules of our program funding leaving people to find assistance elsewhere or to reapply for the next cycle. Adding hearing aids under Mo HealthNet would allow for many individuals new to hearing loss or experiencing late onset of hearing loss an easier way access devices that would have significant impact on their daily lives.

I am a practicing Otolaryngologist subspecialized in Otology and Neurotology (ear and skull base surgery) serving in Springfield, MO. Our practice (and organization - Mercy) is one of a few committed to caring for the underserved in our region. I help provide medical and surgical care for adult and pediatric Medicaid patients that do or would benefit significantly from hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implantation). At this pint, I am the only Otolaryngologist in the region (South Missouri) performing these necessary services. Currently there is no hearing aid or Cochlear Implant coverage				

for adults on Missouri Medicaid over the age of 21 unless they are blind, pregnant, or in a long-term care facility. Despite my organization's commitment to providing care for these patients, they are being denied access to critical healthcare which directly affects their ability to maintain employment and communicate. Expansion of coverage in this area would help these patients obtain critical hearing health services. This would allow many of them to maintain or obtain employment and significantly improve their quality of life in a large majority of cases.
