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Chair, Vice-Chair, members of the committee; thank you for the opportunity to testify today in support of HBs 1446 & 2632 to support the health outcomes of Missourians who rely on Medicaid for pregnancy and postpartum care. Abortion Action Missouri, formerly Pro Choice Missouri, works to protect and expand every Missourians' right to bodily autonomy, to access essential reproductive healthcare including abortion care, to access accurate information to make the best decisions for ourselves and our families, and to parent our children in safety and dignity. For individuals who want to start or grow their families in Missouri, our state remains one of the most dangerous to give birth; Missouri ranks 44th in the country for maternal mortality and Black birthing parents are 3-4 times more likely to die within a year of pregnancy than their white counterparts. For many reasons, including structural racism and implicit bias in medicine, the closure of seven rural hospitals in MO since 2014, a growing number of people falling in the insurance gap, and continued attacks on abortion and reproductive healthcare access, the maternal and infant mortality rates in MO continue to rival that of both peer and less-resourced nations. In short: restrictions on reproductive health care access lead to poor reproductive health outcomes. The Missouri Pregnancy-Associated Mortality Review Report found that the pregnancy-related mortality ratio (PRMR) in Missouri is four times greater for Black women than white women at 87.6 per 100,000 live births. The same review board found that 82% of pregnancyrelated deaths in Missouri were "determined to be preventable." Recommendations for addressing racial and economic disparities in maternal health in Missouri named in the report include increased access to mental health resources throughout pregnancy, increased coverage of postpartum care for low-income mothers and families, and increased uniformity in trauma-informed and culturally competent practices. Doula services empower Missourians to have healthy and safe pregnancies and to give birth in safe and supportive environments on their own terms. This bill would allow for Missourians' access to these vital resources to be more equitable and accessible to people and families without the resources to pay out of pocket. LaKisha Redditt of the St. Louis Doula Project notes that, "Culturally competent care means you understand the health disparities and inequities that happen to Black and brown people and our white counterparts," Redditt says. "We [doulas] look at care from a lens of what happened to a person, as opposed to what's wrong with them."Increasing access to doulas, particularly for Black women and birthing parents, is proven to improve birth outcomes and is an essential component of addressing the high rates of maternal mortality in our region. Often efforts to fund doulas require them to be connected to a hospital or large practice- This excludes community based doulas, often with some of the strongest connections to their communities, from access to support. This bill would create a registration service for doulas who want their clients to have access to state reimbursement for their services, but would not prevent doulas from operating

without registration. Doulas are an essential part of the reproductive healthcare provider network and are uniquely able to provide supportive care to pregnant people no matter their decision or pregnancy outcome. Doulas are also trusted sources on reproductive health education such as providing information related to fertility, nutrition, contraception, pregnancy health, breastfeeding, and quality infant care. Abortion Action Missouri, representing more than 60,000 Missourians across the state, urges you to improve health outcomes for all Missouri parents and children by advancing this bill. Thank you.

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I hope the committee will progress this bill for the good of Missouri mothers. I was unable to afford a doula, but I know they improve outcomes through physical and emotional support as well as through communication that helps patients avoid unnecessary and costly medical interventions. (I am not referring to interventions during medical emergencies.) Many birthing parents experience pressure from hospital staff to submit to procedures that may disrupt or slow labor, and as a remedy to such pressure, a doula's expertise can help patients make informed decisions. Non-exhaustive examples: doulas can help patients avoid lying back with feet in stirrups (a physiologically-awful birthing position) or opt out of IV drugs that can interfere with an already well-progessing labor. When a patient-too preoccupied to run pros and cons--is being urged to take (or allow) a medical step, the doula can ask hospital staff, "Is this necessary?" Overall, they are patient advocates and supporters, who can help improve maternal health in our state, where great improvement is needed.

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Good afternoon. My name is Justice Gatson. I'm representing reproductive justice organizers in our state. We support insurance reimbursements for doulas. We do have concerns around the ability of the named governing body to implement the necessary infrastructure to formalize this process. We want to ensure that history doesn't repeat itself by pushing public policy that doesn't fully account for historical harms that have occurred such as the current Black perinatal & infant crisis. Missouri is on the precipice of creating history with the passage of this bill. This is an amazing opportunity to embed equity into this process by naming Uzazi Village and Jamaa Birth Village as the leading trailblazing organizations whose work has been rooted in decreasing infant and perinatal morbidity and increasing the number of healthy, joy filled labors and births for families across Missouri. These organizations should be deeply involved in all future matters concerning infrastructure, governance and roll out.
