Thank you Mr. Chairman and committee members for allowing me to share my story and I am in full support of HB2651 which creates a fair taxation methodology for solar, limits a county's density of solar and promotes the use of American made products. I'm Charles Greg Crawford, our family has been farming for 4 generations spanning over nearly 100 yrs. The Federal Government is pushing and funding solar and wind projects in the rural heartland of America like we have never experienced in modern history which is removing the most valuable productive land that has fed this Nation and helped sustain the rural communities and counties. The tax methodology in this bill for solar is consistent with wind energy which is still giving them a tax advantage over every other energy sector. This is more than fair since solar is far more detrimental than wind to these rural communities and counties because the land is totally removed from production for 30 to 40 years. Solar is already receiving 30 to 40% federal subsidies. According to Wisconsin U.S. Representative Tom Tiffany, solar companies can get as much as \$50,000 per acre in federal subsidies. The tremendous loss of farm revenue in these rural communities will be devastating. We have identified approximately 12,000 acres slated for solar power plants in Callaway county. Row crop farming generates approximately 1 million dollars in gross revenue per 1,000 acres, so the economic impact for the county will result in loss of jobs and businesses plus their tax revenue. There will be less seed sales, equipment sales, repair and parts sales, crop insurance, chemical and fertilizer sales, farm co-ops, etcThe U.S. is losing farmland at an alarming rate. According to research by American Farmland Trust found between 2001 and 2016 everyday 2000 acres of farmland and ranchland was lost due to urbanization alone. A recent article by Insider Newletter indicated that as much as 363 million acres (two times the size of Texas) would need to be transformed to accomplish the green energy goal of the Inflation Reduction Act (Green Energy bill) in the next 30 years. The 2 percent limitation of cropland in a county would help prevent any one county from getting saddled with the loss of significant amounts of its farmland and farm revenue. The loss of farm revenue is crippling to rural communities. An example of what happens when agricultural farmland is taken out of production, just look at the effects of the small rural communities north of highway 36 after the CRP program was implemented in 1985. The CRP program removed large amounts of farmland from production which resulted in jobs drying up and businesses closing their doors because there was no longer recirculation of farm revenue in these communities. The solar industry is being driven by our federal tax dollars as a result of the Inflation Reduction Act. The least we can do is to help provide U.S. jobs rather than fund Communist China by requiring 75% of the parts and equipment being made in America. This is consistent with the Broadband, Equity, Access and Deployment (BEAD) program for the Telecommunications industry to receive federal funds to spur the development of the U.S. manufacturing industry and create new jobs domestically. Finally, the tax revenue will be huge for the communities that have lost so much farm revenue due to the massive solar projects and will hopefully help them from going backward. It would generate millions of dollars

annually that would benefit the local schools and services provided for these counties.HB2651 is ver important and needs your support. Thank you for your time.	У

In Callaway County any personal business with a value representative of 3,000 acres of solar fields at a cost of \$100 Million per 1,000 acres, would generate a whopping \$6.2 Million per year in taxes to Callaway County. While we can assure the Committee that we do not support the use of eminent domain for solar and wind energy, we can also say eminent domain is not used for the construction of wind and solar generation. At best, this legislation is a solution seeking a problem while vilifying wind and solar as some sinister industry taking property by force and against the will of landowners. Which is never the case. Missouri landowners see wind and solar as a way of making significant income off their property. This is important as Missouri's family farms have been ravaged by years of policies that promote corporate operations at the expense of independent producers as well as trade tariffs that have affected agriculture values.
