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Aristotle divided governments into six different types on the basis of the number of people sharing power (one, few, or many) and whether, in each case, the government was a "true" form, "in which the one, the few, or the many, govern with a view to the common interest" or "perversions", where those in power govern "with a view to the private interest". Governments are composed of individuals, each of whom can be classified on this same basis. Every member of this committee either serves the common interest or private interests. Term limits are not a problem for the private interests who fund the campaigns of politicians who are willing to serve them. They can come up with an endless stream of candidates who will do their bidding in exchange for being given enough money to win elections. Candidates who run for office intending to serve the common interest, and who continue serving the common interest once elected, are harder to come by. They generally have a harder time raising enough money to compete effectively and if they do get elected, they are likely to face well-funded challengers every time they are up for reelection. The need to raise money constantly to remain in office leads to some individuals who entered public service with pure intentions being corrupted by the need to raise money constantly. Term limits are also little more than a nuisance for career politicians who are able, with the help of wealthy benefactors, to get elected to higher offices. When you hit the term limit as a state representative, you run for the state Senate. When you hit the limit for state senators, you run for statewide office, or the U. S. House and then the Senate. Maybe even president. The strongest argument against term limits is that they limit the choices of voters. Voters should individually have the option of deciding when a politician has been in office too long. Whether they have served in one office continually or in a series of offices. And voters should have the option of making exceptions when a career politician has been a good and faithful public servant and has consistently governed with a view to the common interest. I, for one, appreciate anyone who is willing to devote their lives to serving the common interest by running for public office and serving in public office. I support this bill to add flexibility to the term limits in place in Missouri. I support the repeal of term limits. I also believe that the repeal of term limits should be accomplished by the people of Missouri through the initiative process. Which is one more reason I support making the initiative process easier rather than harder.
