1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for
2 Senate Bill No. 71, Page 46, Section 640.011, Line 17, by inserting after all of said section and line
3 the following:

5 "650.900. 1. There is hereby established within the department of public safety office of
6 homeland security the "Missouri Task Force on Nonprofit Safety and Security". The task force shall
7 study and make recommendations on the security needs of nonprofit organizations that are at
8 elevated risk of terrorist attacks in Missouri and make recommendations on the following:

9 (1) The administration and funding for eligible nonprofit entities to apply for federal
10 nonprofit security grants covering security personnel, security training, facility hardening, and other
11 necessary security measures; and

12 (2) Outreach to and education for nonprofit entities about the grant program and the federal
13 nonprofit security grant application process, with a particular focus on engaging and assisting first-
14 time grant applications.

15 2. Members of the task force shall be appointed by the director of the department of public
16 safety and shall include:

17 (1) The director of the office of homeland security or the director's designee;

18 (2) The superintendent of the Missouri state highway patrol or the superintendent's
19 designee;

20 (3) The executive director of the Missouri Sheriffs' Association or the executive director's
21 designee;

22 (4) The executive director of the Missouri Police Chiefs Association or the executive
23 director's designee;

24 (5) The executive director of a statewide interfaith or interreligious organization or the
25 executive director's designee;

26 (6) The executive director of a statewide association of nonprofit organizations or the
27 executive director's designee; and

28 (7) Three representatives from nonprofit organizations including faith-based groups,
29 academia, or organizations that work on countering domestic terrorism and extremism.

1 3. Members of the task force shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for
2 their actual and necessary expenses.

3 4. The task force shall elect a chair by a majority vote of its members.

4 5. The task force shall establish a time and place for its meetings and shall meet at least
5 quarterly, with additional meetings held upon the call of the chair.

6 6. A majority of the total task force members shall constitute a quorum and any official
7 action taken by the task force shall require an affirmative vote of a majority of the members present
8 and voting.

9 7. The task force shall issue a report to the office of homeland security of its findings and
10 recommendations with respect to terrorist attacks in Missouri. The report shall be issued annually
11 and at such other times as deemed necessary by the task force. The report shall also be provided to
12 the chairs and ranking members of the senate committee on appropriations and the house budget
13 committee.

14 650.910. 1. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Supplemental Nonprofit
15 Safety and Security Fund", which shall consist of moneys collected under this section and section
16 650.900. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and
17 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and,
18 upon appropriation, moneys in this fund shall be used solely as provided in this section and section
19 650.900.

20 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining
21 in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund.

22 (3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are
23 invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund.

24 2. The fund shall be used to defray the costs of security enhancements or measures for
25 eligible nonprofit organizations described in subsection 4 of this section, including:

26 (1) Safety and security planning, equipment, training, and exercises;

27 (2) Security-related technology;

28 (3) Threat awareness and response training;

29 (4) Upgrades to existing structures that enhance safety and security; and

30 (5) Vulnerability and threat assessments.

31 3. Nonprofit organizations whose applications for funding through the Federal Emergency
32 Management Agency's nonprofit security grant program have been approved by the department of
33 public safety office of homeland security are eligible for grants from the fund. No additional
34 application shall be required for grants from the fund and an application for a grant from the federal
35 program is also an application for funding from the fund.

36 4. An eligible organization may receive a grant from the fund of up to five percent of the
37 available grant pool for distribution. No grants under the fund shall be awarded until the
38 announcement of the recipients and the amount of the grants awarded under the federal nonprofit
39 security grant program.

1 5. No more than five percent of the available funds available annually shall be used for
2 administration expenses associated with the fund.

3 6. The director may promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of
4 this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created
5 under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is
6 subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and
7 chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to
8 chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently
9 held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after
10 August 28, 2025, shall be invalid and void."; and

12 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
13 accordingly.
