1 AMEND House Amendment No. \_\_\_\_\_ to House Bill No. 478, Page 1, by inserting after the number "478,"  
2 the following:

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4 "Pages 1-3, Section 324.004, Lines 1-60, by deleting all of said Section and Lines and inserting in lieu thereof  
5 the following:

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7 "324.004. 1. Any person who has at least three years of work experience in an occupation or  
8 profession in another state, the District of Columbia, or any combination of such jurisdictions, and whose  
9 work experience involved the practice of an occupation or profession for which a license is not required in  
10 the jurisdiction or jurisdictions in which the person worked but is required in this state, may submit an  
11 application for a one-time nonrenewable two-year temporary license in this state in the occupation or  
12 profession, along with proof of at least three years of work experience in the occupation or profession and a  
13 fee as set by regulation of the oversight body, to the relevant oversight body in this state. The oversight body  
14 shall make a determination of qualification within forty-five days of receiving a completed application.

15 2. The oversight body shall require an applicant under this section to take and pass the profession-  
16 specific examination required for licensure by those applying pursuant to the provisions of the oversight  
17 body's statutory and regulatory authority. An oversight body that administers an examination on the laws of  
18 this state as part of its licensing application requirements may require an applicant under this section to take  
19 and pass an examination specific to the laws of this state.

20 3. The oversight body shall not issue a one-time nonrenewable temporary license to any applicant  
21 described in subsection 1 of this section who has had any license in the relevant occupation or profession  
22 revoked by an oversight body outside of this state, who is currently under investigation, who has a complaint  
23 pending, or who is currently under disciplinary action.

24 4. Applicants for the one-time nonrenewable temporary license shall be citizens of the United States  
25 and shall submit legal proof of citizenship as part of the application.

26 5. If an applicant is not currently residing in this state, the oversight board shall conditionally  
27 approve the application contingent upon receipt of proof of domicile in this state within ninety days of the  
28 applicant receiving the temporary license. If the applicant fails to provide proof within ninety days of

1 receiving the temporary license, the oversight board may terminate the temporary license and the applicant  
2 may reapply for a temporary license.

3 6. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the following:

4 (1) Any occupation whose oversight body has entered into a licensing compact with another state for  
5 the regulation of practice under the oversight body's jurisdiction. The provisions of this section shall not be  
6 construed to alter the authority granted by, or any requirements promulgated pursuant to, any  
7 interjurisdictional or interstate compacts adopted by this state or any reciprocity agreements with other states,  
8 and whenever possible the provisions of this section shall be interpreted so as to imply no conflict between it  
9 and any compact or any reciprocity agreement with other states;

10 (2) Any occupation set forth in subsection 6 of section 290.257 or any electrical contractor licensed  
11 under sections 324.900 to 324.945;

12 (3) Any occupation whose regulators or licensees are required to comply with specific federal  
13 statutory, regulatory, and administrative requirements in order to practice in Missouri; or

14 (4) Assistant physicians licensed under chapter 334.

15 7. The one-time nonrenewable temporary license shall expire after two years. Upon expiration, the  
16 individual shall be required to apply for a permanent license in accordance with the license requirements for  
17 the occupation for which he or she held the temporary license.

18 8. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a license issued under this section  
19 shall be valid only in this state and shall not make a licensee eligible to be part of an interstate compact. An  
20 applicant who is licensed in another state pursuant to an interstate compact shall not be eligible for licensure  
21 by an oversight body under the provisions of this section.

22 9. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a license issued under this section  
23 shall be valid only in this state and shall not make a licensee eligible to obtain a license by reciprocity in  
24 another state.

25 10. As used in this section, the term "oversight body" means any board, department, agency, or  
26 office of a jurisdiction that issues occupational or professional licenses.

27 11. The division of professional registration may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of  
28 this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the  
29 authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the  
30 provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable  
31 and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the  
32 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of  
33 rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2025, shall be invalid and void."; and
