In the event that a local law 46 47 enforcement agency opts not to set up a system and an abduction occurs within the jurisdiction, it shall notify 48 the department of public safety who will notify local media 49 in the region. 50 The Amber alert system shall include all state 51 agencies capable of providing urgent and timely information 52 53 to the public together with broadcasters and other private

agencies capable of providing urgent and timely information to the public together with broadcasters and other private entities that volunteer to participate in the dissemination of urgent public information. At a minimum, the Amber alert system shall include the department of public safety, highway patrol, department of transportation, department of health and senior services, and Missouri lottery.

- 59 5. The department of public safety shall have the authority to notify other regions upon verification that the criteria established by the oversight committee has been met.
- 6. Participation in an Amber alert system is entirely 63 at the option of local law enforcement agencies and 64 federally licensed radio and television broadcasters.
- 7. Any person who knowingly makes a false report that triggers an alert pursuant to this section is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
- 8. The department of public safety shall not
 discriminate against any person because of race, color,
 religion, national origin, ancestry, sex, disability, or
 familial status when coordinating with local law enforcement
 agencies and public commercial television and radio
 broadcasters to provide an effective system."; and
