ASSUMPTION

§542.525 – Surveillance or Cameras on Private Property

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume any additional litigation costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing personnel and resources. However, the AGO may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight assumes the AGO will be able to perform any additional duties required by this proposal with current staff and resources and will reflect no fiscal impact to the AGO for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the Office of Administration (Administrative Hearing Commission & Budget and Planning), the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Economic Development, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Public Safety (Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control, Capitol Police, Fire Safety, Office of the Director, Missouri Gaming Commission, Missouri Highway Patrol, Missouri Veterans Commission, State Emergency Management Agency), the Department of Social Services, the Office of the Governor, the Missouri Department of Agriculture, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri National Guard, the MoDOT & Patrol Employees' Retirement System, the Office of Administration, the Petroleum Storage Tank Insurance Fund, the Office of the Secretary of State the Office of the State Public Defender, the Office of the State Treasurer, the University of Missouri System, the Office of the State Auditor, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Joint Committee on Education, the Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement, Legislative Research, the Oversight Division, the Missouri Senate, the Missouri Lottery Commission, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Missouri State Employee's Retirement System, the State Tax Commission, the City of Kansas City, the Phelps County Sheriff's Office, the Kansas City Police **Department** and the **St. Louis County Police Department** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to similar legislation from 2024, HB 1788, officials from the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, the Missouri Higher Education Loan Authority, the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the City of Springfield, the City of Urich and the Branson Police Department each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any

information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, counties and local law enforcement agencies were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not.
