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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§319.065 – Underground Telecommunications Facilities, with Penalty Provisions

In response to similar legislation from this year, HB 1135, officials from the Morgan County PWSD #2, the St. Charles County PWSD #2 and the Tipton Water/Wastewater each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight notes that violations of section §319.065 could result in fines or penalties. Oversight also notes per Article IX Section 7 of the Missouri Constitution fines and penalties collected by counties are distributed to school districts. Fine varies widely from year to year and are distributed to the school district where the violation occurred. Oversight will reflect a positive fiscal impact of \$0 to Unknown to local school districts. For simplicity, Oversight will not reflect the possibility that fine revenue paid to school districts may act as a subtraction in the foundation formula.

§442.671 - Uniform Easement Relocation Act

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** and the **St. Charles County PWSD #2** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from Morgan County PWSD #2, the City of Osceola and Osceola Water/Wastewater each responded to Oversight's request for fiscal impact but did not provide fiscal impact statements for this proposal.

Responses regarding the proposed legislation as a whole

Officials from the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Natural Resources, the Missouri Department of Agriculture, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Office of Administration, the Office of the Secretary of State, Kansas City, the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District, the South River Drainage District, the Wayne County PWSD #2, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and the State Tax Commission each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, counties, utility districts and electric companies and coops were requested

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to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.
