FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§70.441, 571.030, 571.101, 571.104, 571.107, 571.111, 571.117, 571.128, 571.205, 571.215, 571.225, 577.703, and 577.712 – CCW

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume any additional litigation costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing personnel and resources. However, the AGO may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight assumes the AGO will be able to perform any additional duties required by this proposal with current staff and resources and will reflect no fiscal impact to the AGO for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol, the Department of Revenue, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri National Guard, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Missouri Senate, the Office of the State Public Defender, the City of Kansas City, the Phelps County Sheriff's Department, the Kansas City Police Department, and the St. Louis County Sheriff's Department** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to similar legislation from 2024 (HB 1708), officials from and **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight notes this bill lowers the age requirement from nineteen to eighteen for a concealed carry permit, which may increase the number of CCW applications submitted to county sheriffs. Oversight assumes any increase in revenue to sheriff's departments will be offset by an increase in cost to process the applications for CCW permits. Therefore, the impact to local governments-sheriff's departments will be presented as netting to \$0.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

FIREARMS (Sections 70.441, 571.030, 571.101, 571.104, 571.107, 571.111, 571.117, 571.128, 571.205, 571.215, 571.225, 577.703, and 577.712)

Currently, it is a crime to board a bus with a dangerous or deadly weapon or carry such a weapon in a terminal.

This bill allows a concealed carry permit holder to lawfully carry firearms on public transportation. Anyone with a permit may also carry a firearm while traveling by bus. This bill does not apply to the property of Amtrak or any partnership in which Amtrak engages.

The bill expands the listed items that satisfy the requirement that an applicant for a concealed carry permit demonstrate knowledge of firearms safety training to include, for active-duty military service members, receipt of a pistol marksmanship recognition.

Currently, an applicant is not eligible for a concealed carry permit or a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit if the applicant has pled guilty to, entered a plea of nolo contendere, or been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment of a term exceeding one year or has pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere to one or more misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a five-year period immediately preceding application for the permit. This bill removes the ban on eligibility for a concealed carry permit or a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit if the applicant has pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere for such crimes.

The bill expands the list of persons exempted from certain prohibitions on the unlawful use of weapons as provided for in 571.030, RSMo, to now include certain retired judiciary members and current and former members of the General Assembly when in possession of a concealed carry permit.


The bill lowers the age requirement from at least 19 to 18 years of age or older for concealed carry permits.

The bill repeals the prohibition on the concealed carrying of firearms in churches and other places of worship by a person with a valid concealed carry permit.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
