## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTION

§§70.441, 571.030, 571.101, 571.104, 571.107, 571.111, 571.117, 571.128, 571.205, 571.215, 571.225, 577.703, and 577.712 – CCW

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume any additional litigation costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing personnel and resources. However, the AGO may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

**Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight assumes the AGO will be able to perform any additional duties required by this proposal with current staff and resources and will reflect no fiscal impact to the AGO for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol, the Department of Revenue, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri National Guard, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Missouri Senate, the Office of the State Public Defender, the City of Kansas City, the City of O’Fallon, the Phelps County Sheriff’s Department, the Branson Police Department, the Kansas City Police Department, and the St. Louis County Police Department** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

**Oversight** notes this bill lowers the age requirement from nineteen to eighteen for a concealed carry permit, which may increase the number of CCW applications submitted to county sheriffs. Oversight assumes any increase in revenue to sheriff’s departments will be offset by an increase in cost to process the applications for CCW permits. Therefore, the impact to local governments-sheriff’s departments will be presented as netting to \$0.
