FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§558.022 – Enhanced sentence for wearing face or body coverings

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** state the proposal establishes laws relating to an enhanced sentence for wearing face or body coverings during the commission of an offense. Section 558.022 creates a penalty for the commission of an offense while wearing concealment, with a penalty equal to a misdemeanor or felony one class higher than that for which they are convicted.

Due to lack of data on face or body coverings worn at the time of commission of offenses, the department is unable to estimate impact. Therefore, this legislation will have an unknown fiscal impact on the department.

Oversight does not have any information contrary to that provided by DOC. Therefore, Oversight will reflect DOC's impact for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume any potential litigation costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in litigation or investigation costs.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight assumes the AGO will be able to perform any additional duties required by this proposal with current staff and resources and will reflect no fiscal impact to the AGO for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services (MOPS)** assume the proposal will have no measurable fiscal impact on MOPS. The enactment of a new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors and the circuit attorney which may, in turn, result in additional costs, which are difficult to determine.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Office of the State Public Defender**, the **Phelps County Sheriff's Department**, the **Kansas City Police Department**, and the **St. Louis County Police Department** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local law enforcement were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

CRIMINAL ACTIVITY WHILE MASKED (Section 558.022)

This bill creates a penalty enhancement for individuals who wear, during the commission of a misdemeanor or felony, a mask, hood, disguise, or other clothing that conceals or attempts to conceal the person's identity at the time of the offense. The penalty enhancement is a misdemeanor or felony one class higher than the underlying misdemeanor or felony for which the person was convicted. If a defendant pleads guilty or no contest to the underlying offense but not guilty to the enhancement offense specified in the bill, a jury will be empaneled to determine the issues.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
