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#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### ASSUMPTION

§21.750 – Civil Suits involving Firearms and Amendment II of the Constitution

Officials from the **Office of Administration-General Services (OA/GS)** assume this legislation creates provisions and damages relating to firearm deprival and includes a waiver of sovereign immunity for actions brought under this section. This has the potential to increase costs to the Legal Expense Fund (LEF) but would be subject to judicial construction. Therefore, the cost is unknown.

**Oversight** does not have any information contrary to that provided by OA/GS. Therefore, Oversight will reflect OA/GS's potential unknown impact for fiscal note purposes to the State Legal Expense Fund. Oversight notes the Legal Expense Fund is funded by the General Revenue Fund as well as other state funds and federal funds. Oversight notes this possible litigation exposure as described by OA could also apply to colleges and universities and local political subdivisions.

Officials from **Kansas City** state the proposed legislation has a negative fiscal impact of an indeterminate amount because it potentially increases the City's liability and waives sovereign immunity.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume any potential litigation costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. However, the AGO may seek additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in litigation or investigation.

**Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight assumes the AGO will be able to perform any additional duties required by this proposal with current staff and resources and will reflect no fiscal impact to the AGO for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Department of Public Safety (Capitol Police, Office of the Director & Missouri Highway Patrol), the City of O'Fallon, the Phelps County Sheriff's Office, the Kansas City Police Department, the St. Louis County Police Department each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to similar legislation from this year, SB 74, officials from the **Department of Revenue** and the **Branson Police Department** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

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**Oversight** only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, counties and local law enforcement agencies were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

## FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

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#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, the state preempts the entire field of legislation surrounding firearms. Political subdivisions cannot pass any ordinance relating to the sale, purchase, ownership, or possession of firearms, except to regulate the open carrying of firearms. This bill repeals the exception that allows political subdivisions to regulate the open carrying of firearms.

This bill also adds that any violation of this provision will subject the political subdivision to a penalty of \$50,000 per occurrence. Any person injured by such a violation will have standing to pursue an action for injunctive relief.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
