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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

376.448- Enrollee's Cost Sharing

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation** state this bill may increase costs for PBMs, which will likely pass on costs to the MoDOT-MSHP medical plan. This would have an unknown negative impact to the State Road Fund.

Since it is unknown if this proposal will result in a cost to the medical plan that could pass on to members, **Oversight** will range the fiscal impact as \$0 to Unknown, greater than \$250,000 to the State Road Fund (0320). Oversight assumes this proposal could have a fiscal impact on local political subdivisions.

Oversight notes provisions of 376.417.3 imposes a civil penalty on any health carrier, pharmacy benefits manage, or agent or affiliate of such health carrier or pharmacy benefits manager that violates provisions of this subsection. The penalty may not exceed \$5,000 per day. Oversight notes that violations resulting in fines could vary widely from year to year. Civil penalties collected per Article IX, Section 7 of the Missouri Constitution requires fines to be distributed to the school district where the violation occurred; therefore, Oversight will reflect a positive fiscal impact of \$0 to Unknown to local school districts on the fiscal note.

Officials from the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Social Services, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the City of O'Fallon and Kansas City each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note for this agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** defer to the Missouri Department of Transportation for the potential fiscal impact of this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

A direct fiscal impact to health carrier or pharmacy benefits manager could be expected as a result of this proposal.

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits health carriers and pharmacy benefits managers from discriminating against entities that dispense 340B drugs, including less reimbursement, imposing different terms, and other discriminatory practices.

The Director of the Department of Commerce and Insurance will create rules to enforce these provisions. The Department will impose a civil penalty on any health carrier, pharmacy benefit manager, or agent of affiliate of such health carrier or pharmacy benefit manager that violates the requirements of this bill. The penalty cannot exceed \$5,000 dollars per violation per day.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
