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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§251.034 – Regional Planning Commissions

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning (B&P)** assume the following regarding this proposal:

This legislation increases the amount of state funds Missouri regional planning commissions can receive under §251.034. Under this legislation, the annual funding cap for the East-West Gateway Coordinating Council and Mid-America Regional Council Regional Planning Commissions is raised from \$65,000 to \$130,000, while the remaining seventeen regional planning commission's annual funding caps are each increased from \$25,000 to \$50,000.

Regional planning commissions' funding is subject to appropriation, so B&P assumes state costs could rise anywhere from \$0 - \$555,000 in fiscal year 2026. Further, the legislation mandates annual funding caps be adjusted with the consumer price index beginning in July, 2026, and each year after, so state costs could rise anywhere from \$0 - \$577,200 in fiscal year 2027 and from \$0 - \$599,844 in fiscal year 2028, assuming an inflation rate of 2% each year.

B&P assumes increased state distributions to regional planning commissions will be funded through the General Revenue Fund, as these grants are currently funded through General Revenue in §5.310 of HB 2005 (2024).

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development** and **Missouri Department of Transportation** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to a similar proposal from 2025 (SB 477), officials from the **Southeast Missouri Regional Planning and Economic Development Commission** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Oversight notes the regional planning commissions receive funds from the Office of Administration and are required to be matched with local funds. This proposal doubles those limits and also provides for adjustments with the consumer price index beginning July 1, 2026. Oversight will reflect amounts "Up to" the proposed new amounts as these are caps, not actual appropriations. Oversight will use an inflation rate of 2% to calculate the amounts for FY 2027 and beyond.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Under current law, state funds for the East-West Gateway Coordinating Council and for the Mid-America Regional Council are not to exceed \$65,000 and state funds for other regional planning commissions must not exceed \$25,000. This bill changes the sums to \$130,000 and \$50,000.

Additionally, the bill removes the regional planning commissions of Show-Me, Missouri Valley, Ozark Gateway, ABCD, and Lakes County and adds Harry S. Truman, MO-Kan, Pioneer Trails, and Southwest Missouri.

Beginning July 1, 2026, the maximum grant amount for each regional planning commission will be adjusted with the Consumer Price Index.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
