FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§9.411 & 210.1150 – Fathership Month in Missouri and Fathership Project

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning** deferred to the Department of Social Services for the potential fiscal impact of this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services – Division of Legal Services (DSS-DLS)** state this proposal will require the DSS-DLS to assist in the grant process as well as in executing contracts with grantees. Since the quantity scale of the grants is unknown, the quantity of legal work is similarly unknown. DSS-DLS is requesting 1 legal counsel to assist with the grants process.

Additionally, the activities set forth in the proposed legislation may not qualify for federal funding. If they do not, general revenue will be needed to fund these activities. This cost, with or without federal funding, is unknown but potentially significant depending on how much the General Assembly appropriates for the program.

Oversight will reflect the estimates as provided by the DSS for Office of Fatherhood program expenses. Oversight assumes the appropriation for grant funds could exceed \$250,000.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Office of Administration** and the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

House Amendment #1 – Titling Change

Oversight assumes no direct fiscal impact from this amendment.

<u>House Amendment #2 - §210.1150 – Restores Certain Licenses to Fathers in the Fathership Project</u>

Oversight assumes this amendment allows a father who participates in the project and who is making regular child support payments or who is complying with court-ordered visitation and custody order to have certain licenses restored under this project. While the licenses to restore under this amendment may have some cost to certain state agencies, Oversight assumes the cost can be absorbed within those agencies and will have no direct fiscal impact from this amendment.

<u>House Amendment #3 - §452.402 – Grandparent Visitation Rights</u>

In response to similar legislation this year, HCS for HB 1165, officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** and **Department of Social Services** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight assumes this amendment is establishing new provisions within statute regarding certain circumstances where a grandparent may file for visitation rights of a grandchild. Oversight assumes these new provisions will have no direct fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance**, the **Missouri Highway Patrol** and the **Office of the State Treasurer** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill designates the month of June as "Fathership Month" in Missouri, encouraging events and activities to raise awareness about the importance of fathers being a part of their children's lives.

Additionally, the bill establishes within the Department of Social Services' Family Support Division the "Missouri Fathership Project", to promote fathership and empower fathers to become successful in fathership.

The bill establishes a grant program and accompanying fund for family-focused community agencies, faith-based agencies, family advocacy programs, and nonprofit organizations to apply for in order to hire, train, and facilitate fathership project specialists, who are to serve as a point of contact for fathers who want to reestablish and strengthen relationships with their children.

The bill specifies the duties of fathership project specialists, including, but not limited to, being dispatched to engage with a father who does not comply with a court-ordered case plan, at which point a court or the division is required to issue a referral to a partnering entity utilizing services from a fathership project specialist.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
