#### **ASSUMPTION**

§173.1352 – Undergraduate course credits for students who score 4 or higher on international baccalaureate exams

Officials from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development, the Northwest Missouri State University, and the University of Missouri System each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to similar legislation, SB 243 (2025), officials from **University of Central Missouri** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other colleges and universities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not.
