Bill Summary: This proposal authorizes a temporary extension of hours for alcoholic beverage sales by certain liquor licensees for the duration of the 2026 FIFA World Cup Tournament.

## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTION

#### §311.2026 – FIFA World Cup Tournament

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)**, the **Department of Public Safety – Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control**, the **Department of Commerce and Insurance, Kansas City, O’Fallon** and **Osceola** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal extends the hours that alcohol is allowed for consumption during the FIFA World Cup Tournament and expires on July 20, 2026. Oversight will reflect a \$0 to unknown revenue gain for this proposal for local political subdivisions for FY 2026.

#### FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

Small businesses who participate in the extended hours of selling alcohol during the FIFA World Cup Tournament could have a positive impact from this proposal.

### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill allows any establishment licensed to sell liquor by the drink at retail for consumption on the premises to sell, serve, and allow for the consumption of alcohol between 6:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. the following day for the duration of the 2026 FIFA World Cup Tournament, June 11, 2026 through July 19, 2026.

Licensees are not required to apply for special or temporary licenses or permits in order to extend their alcohol sales hours.

Any city, county, district, or other political subdivision may, by ordinance, exempt itself from the provisions of this bill or modify the temporary period for extended alcohol sales hours.

This provision expires on July 20, 2026.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
