AN ACT

To repeal section 210.1253, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to residential care facilities.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

- Section A. Section 210.1253, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 210.1253, to read as follows:
- 210.1253. As used in sections 210.1250 to 210.1286, unless the context clearly 2 provides otherwise, the following terms mean:
 - (1) "Access to children", direct contact with children on a continual, frequent, and meaningful basis in the delivery of treatment, consulting, religious, educational, or sports activities or recreational or entertainment services;
 - (2) "Child", a person who is under eighteen years of age;
- 7 [(2)] (3) "Department", the department of social services, or the children's division 8 within the department of social services, as determined by the department;
- 9 [(3)] (4) "Director", a person who is responsible for the operation of the residential 10 care facility;
- 11 [(4)] (5) "Exempt-from-licensure" or "license-exempt", a residential care facility that 12 is not required to be licensed under section 210.516;
- 13 [(5)] (6) "Person", an individual, partnership, organization, association, or 14 corporation;
- [(6)] (7) "Residential care facility", any place, facility, or home operated by any person who receives children who are not related to the operator and whose parent or guardian is not a resident of the same facility and that provides such children with
