# HOUSE BILL NO. 811

## **103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY**

#### INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE REED.

### AN ACT

To amend chapter 324, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the issuance of professional licenses to recipients of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 324, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 324.1175, to read as follows:

324.1175. 1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

2 (1) "DACA recipient", any individual who is protected from deportation under
3 the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program and who holds a valid
4 work authorization under the program;

5 (2) "License", a license, certificate, registration, permit, or accreditation that 6 enables a person to legally practice an occupation or profession in this state;

7 (3) "Oversight body", any board, department, agency, or office of this state that 8 issues licenses.

9 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any DACA recipient who has met 10 all educational and professional requirements for a particular occupation or profession 11 for which a license is required in this state shall be eligible for licensure in that 12 occupation or profession on the same basis as a United States citizen or legal permanent 13 resident.

3. All oversight bodies shall consider license applications from DACA recipients
 without regard to citizenship or immigration status.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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4. License applications from DACA recipients shall be evaluated based solely on
 qualifications, education, and professional competency. DACA recipients shall not be
 subject to additional or separate requirements beyond those imposed on United States
 citizens or legal permanent residents.

5. DACA recipients granted licenses in accordance with the provisions of this section shall have all the same rights, responsibilities, and protections in their respective fields as any other licensees.

6. Any license granted in accordance with the provisions of this section shall be renewable and valid for the same period as a license issued to a United States citizen or legal permanent resident, provided that the licensee maintains valid work authorization.

7. The provisions of this section shall apply to all license applications submitted
on or after August 28, 2025.

28 8. The department of commerce and insurance, in conjunction with oversight bodies, shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or 29 30 portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the 31 authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is 32 subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This 33 section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to 34 35 disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2025, shall be 36 37 invalid and void.

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
