## AN ACT

Relating to sickle cell awareness month.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

WHEREAS, sickle cell disease is a group of genetic red blood cell disorders that include sickle cell anemia - a condition in which the red blood cells become hard and sticky and take on a curved shape, like a sickle, making it hard for them to move through the bloodstream which causes damage to the blood vessels resulting in complications such as lung, spleen, kidney, or liver damage, and stroke which leads to severe pain and disability; and

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WHEREAS, sickle cell disease is the most common hereditary hematologic disorder in the world, which occurs in individuals who are born with two sickle cell genes, each inherited from one parent. This affects approximately 100,000 Americans; and

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WHEREAS, 2.5 million Americans or one out of every 12 African Americans and one out of every 100 Latinos in the United States have only one sickle cell gene that is called "sickle cell trait", and unlike most people with sickle cell disease, people who have sickle cell trait may never know they have it and can live their entire lives without complications from it; and

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WHEREAS, people with sickle cell trait should be aware of their condition for family planning purposes because they can pass the gene onto their children. If both parents have sickle cell trait, there is a greater chance that one or more of their children will be born with sickle cell disease; and

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23	WHEREAS, the state of Missouri provides newborn screening to all children born in
24	the state since 1989, which includes tests for sickle cell disease and trait, and this has reduced
25	the death rate for children born with sickle cell disease due to earlier interventions; and
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27	WHEREAS, there is currently only one FDA approved drug for sickle cell disease
28	because developing new medicines and other treatment options is a complex process that
29	involves clinical trials to explore whether a medical strategy, treatment, or device is safe and
30	effective; and
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32	WHEREAS, many barriers exist that account for the low rate of participation among
33	diverse communities, including patient fear of experimentation and lack of understanding or
34	education with regard to the importance of clinical trials in creating new treatments and cures;

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37	WHEREAS, September is recognized nationwide as Sickle Cell Awareness Month:
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39	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of
40	Representatives of the One Hundred Third General Assembly, First Regular Session, the
41	Senate concurring therein, hereby designate the month of September as Sickle Cell
42	Awareness Month in Missouri; and
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44	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Assembly encourages all citizens
45	of this state to participate in appropriate events and activities to raise awareness about the
46	pervasiveness of the sickle cell trait and available programs and screenings; and
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48	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Governor for his
49	approval or rejection pursuant to the Missouri Constitution.
