18	waste, fraud, and abuse in government, proving herself to be a steadfast guardian of taxpayer

21	WHEREAS, in 2006, Claire McCaskill made history once more by becoming the first
22	woman elected to the United States Senate from Missouri, where she served with distinction
23	for twelve years; and

26	working to reform the Department of Veterans Affairs and ensure that those who served our
