#### AN ACT

To repeal section 569.170, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the offense of burglary in the second degree, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 569.170, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 569.170, to read as follows:

569.170. 1. A person commits the offense of burglary in the second degree when he or she knowingly enters unlawfully or knowingly remains unlawfully in:

- 3 (1) A building or inhabitable structure for the purpose of committing a crime therein; 4 or
- 5 (2) A restricted area of a commercial business for the purpose of committing a 6 crime and the restricted area is:
- 7 (a) Commonly reserved for personnel of the commercial business where money 8 or other property is kept; or
- 9 **(b)** Clearly marked with a sign or signs that indicate to the public that entry is 0 forbidden.
- 2. (1) The offense of burglary in the second degree committed under subdivision
  12 (1) of subsection 1 of this section is a class D felony.
- 13 (2) The offense of burglary in the second degree committed under subdivision (2) 14 of subsection 1 of this section is a class B misdemeanor unless committed as a second or
