	WHEREAS, the current regime in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea
2	(DPRK), commonly known as North Korea, is a cruel, dynastic tyranny that severely violates
3	the human rights and humanitarian conditions of its people through policies implemented by
4	the Kim family, starting with the dictatorship of Kim Il-sung in 1948 and continuing over 70
5	years through three generations with the latest succession of present-day leader Kim Jong-un;

WHEREAS, the North Korean government abuses its power by exerting total control over every facet of life in North Korea, actively suppressing dissent and maintaining a pervasive climate of fear and intimidation by subjecting its people to forced starvation and labor, sexual violence against women and children, torture, public executions, enforced disappearances, and systematically denying its citizens the freedoms of movement, religion, and speech; and

WHEREAS, 10 years after the United Nations established a Commission of Inquiry, North Korea still has fully operational political prison camps with an estimated 80,000 to 120,000 prisoners in inhumane conditions, often for crimes committed by their relatives or for expressing dissenting views; and

WHEREAS, reports from Korea Future, a nongovernmental organization, documented specific examples of North Korean government punishments, including forcing women to have abortions when seven or eight months pregnant and prisoners being fed as little as 80 grams (less than 3 ounces) of corn a day, a starvation diet that caused weight to drop from 60 kilograms (132 pounds) to 37 kilograms (82 pounds) within a month and required prisoners to supplement their diets with cockroaches and rodents; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations General Assembly has passed a resolution condemning North Korea's dire human rights situation every year since 2005; and

30 WHEREAS, the U.S. Senate has introduced the North Korean Human Rights 31 Reauthorization Act of 2022 to ensure the U.S. continues to promote basic freedoms of 32 speech, press, and religion in North Korea for the next five years: 33 34
