HB 138 -- CONFIDENTIALITY OF MOTOR VEHICLE RECORDS

SPONSOR: Justus

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Legislative Review by a vote of 6 to 0. Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Rules-Legislative by a vote of 10 to 0.

This bill clarifies that the Department of Revenue cannot release the home address or any other information that identifies a vehicle owned or leased by any person who is an active or retired county, State, or Federal parole officer, Federal pretrial officer, a peace officer, a person vested under the Missouri Constitution with judicial power, a member of the Federal judiciary, or a member of such person's immediate family contained in the Department's motor vehicle or driver registration records.

This bill is the same as HB 2843 (2024).

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that when the law was previously changed it mistakenly left out retired law enforcement officers, who may still need confidentiality due to the sensitive nature of their past jobs.

Testifying in person for the bill was Representative Justus.

OPPONENTS: There was no opposition voiced to the committee.
